### [Chicken and Eggs: A Tale of Mindfulness](#)

A while back, I listened to Chris Markert who is a Lutheran Franciscan – a modern monastic. I asked him about his vow of poverty. *What does that look like? Do you, for example, buy the 99 cents per dozen eggs so that you live on the least amount of money? Or the \$5 free-range eggs because they are more earth friendly?* His answer, which wasn't very satisfying to me at the time, was, *"Each person must make that decision for themselves."*

I listened to a Rabbi who said, *"The kosher food laws are concerned with killing the animal in the least painful way. But modern observant young Jews frequently wish to know that the animal was treated well during its lifetime. So, they are more likely to buy a pasture-raised chicken than go to the kosher butcher."* And then there was the Imam who said that observant Muslims display *Revelation mixed with Reason*. (no chickens in this example). He said that we need to see the *"text in context."*

All three of these people of God observe that God wishes us to be mindful in all our actions. We are called to make thoughtful choices. This is a lot harder than blindly following law or custom. This takes some thought, some prayer, some feelings. It takes an attitude of openness, of listening, of learning.

Jesus teaches us to *practice the spirit of the law, not just the letter of the law*. So how will I know if I am right? This is where faith, hope, and love take center stage.

Richard Rohr wrote: "I don't need to be perfectly certain before I take the next step. Now I can trust that even my mistakes will be used in my favor, if I allow them to be. Love is the source and goal, faith is the slow process of getting there, and hope is the willingness to move forward without resolution or closure."

So how much water I use, which foods I choose to eat, which products I purchase, how I interact with other people – all of these and more can remind me of my relationship with God and how God has asked us to live in this world.

*God, grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change,  
 Courage to change the things I can,  
 And the wisdom to know the difference.  
 Grant me also Lord, the ability to learn and to make thoughtful choices.  
 In faith, in hope and in love with you, Lord. Amen*

# Stewardship and Finance Committee Report

**Mid-Year Financial Update**—Dale has completed the financial statements as of June 30, 2017, and shown below is a summary of results for the 6 months ended June 30, 2017, and a comparison to budget and last year.

You will note that “current” income is approximately \$3,800 better than budget, and about \$1,800 less than what we received for the same 6 month period last year. Our bottom line is about \$8,000 better than budget, but about \$11,600 less than last year.

**Available Cash**—Our available cash (total cash less the balance in dedicated funds) as of June 30, 2017 and June 30, 2016 was:

This is an increase of approximately \$21,000 over the same time last year, and for that we are thankful.

**Dedicated Funds**—At June 30, 2017 the balance in the dedicated funds account was \$127,276, which includes a generous gift from the estate of Myrtle Boenig of \$26,500 which was received in June.

As we look ahead to the remainder of the year, we are cautiously and prayerfully optimistic that we will achieve our budgeted financial results. We are blessed and thankful for the support of our members and pray that we continue to prayerfully support our various ministries.

Finally, let us remember, as Dave Ramsey would say, **WE ARE DEBT FREE!**

## Art Camp — A ministry in a whole new way

As I sit and reflect on now 5 years of this ministry, I thank God for the beauty that it has showed me and so many others. Each year we have welcomed kids from so many walks of life into Christ the King to fellowship, to make messes, to create, to praise God in a way that many do not get to. That is the beauty of Art Camp. You won't find us singing Kum Ba Yah. You won't find us having a traditional Bible study time. You will definitely see God. The beauty of God in seeing kids interacting with a young adult and his service dog. Kids wanting to help him and wanting to know more about why he can't speak. Kids learning to Pray in Color and going home to talk to their moms and dads—telling them about praying for grandpa while coloring and drawing a picture and turning that quiet time into a beautiful colorful prayer. Shepherding both youth and helpers to a lifelong appreciation of each other, an appreciation of the beauty of God's creation and want to come back for more and to do more. Realizing that they are "aging out" of Art Camp and wanting to know if I will consider having higher grades at Art Camp because they don't want that time of creating and learning about art and God to end. Serving Neighbors near and far having French students visiting and coming to create art and visiting with the students about them and having kids ask lots of questions.

When I began the dream and vision of Art Camp, I modeled it after a friend's Art Camp at her church in Minnesota. The themes for the week are always based in scripture and prayer. God shows up in ways I sometimes can't even imagine. I did not advertise for this summer's ministries because of my family's health issues in May. God showed up even there in that people approached me wondering when it was. I barely opened registrations and God showed up again maxing out both camps almost immediately. Kids who couldn't come this year, their parents advertised for me to let their friends know about Art Camp. It's definitely not traditional. We usually make a mess (and clean it up) The beauty of Art Camp and seeing kids discover more about themselves and creating with their hands and minds continues to show me the love and Glory of God in truly amazing ways.
