"Hi! How are you doing?" "I'm good, just busy." This greeting and exchange is well known to many of us. We hear it said often and even say it ourselves. I know I'm guilty. A classmate of mine recently wrote on his blog, "Carl Jung once said, 'Busyness is not just FROM the devil, it IS the devil.' When I look at the pace at which we live these days, I cannot help but conclude he was right. The evil one has taken the Transitive Property of Equality (if A = B, and B = C, then A = C) and twisted it into the Transitive Property of Busyness. If busyness equals

productivity, and productivity is good, then busyness is good. And we believe the lie."

There are all sorts of articles online that you can read and some are even popping up on my friends' Facebook feeds. Two of which are at http://www.onbeing.org/blog/the-disease-of-being-busy/7023#.V1QI7Of7-z0.facebook and https://www.washingtonpost.com/news/inspired-life/wp/2015/03/17/six-reasons-why-you-shouldnt-use-the-bword-so-much/ in case you're interested in reading them. Some of these articles discuss how busyness is terrible for our spirituality. In light of all this, I have an insightful quote and a provocative idea that are helpful in our busyness.

"In Oriental philosophy, emptiness is understood not only in terms of humility, but also in terms of great usefulness. It is the empty vessel that can carry the needed load. It is the empty cup that can be filled with a nourishing drink. It is the empty streambed that can carry the run-off from the spring rains. (And boy have we had plenty of that this year!) It is the empty lake that can receive the rushing melt of the mountain snows (or flood waters – just think about Medina Lake and Canyon Lake both being restored to 100% capacity). In emptiness, one can become more than previously possible, because there is the capacity in emptiness to be filled."

So how much "empty" is in your life on a regular basis? Do you have many empty hours? Or are they all filled with activity and doing and running and going? Do you allow times of emptiness in your life so that you can be MORE useful in your times of work or study?

"God is like water for fish. Fish are made up of water; water is a part of their bodies. Likewise, God is a part of who we are. Fish constantly swim through water and take it in. It passes through them; in their mouths and out their gills. So God is constantly passing through us. Fish swim in water and water supports them and surrounds them at all times."

Do you see God in your life in this way – as being part of who you are, constantly passing through every part of your being, supporting you and surrounding you in all that you do? It strikes me funny that both of these ideas have mentioned water (at least in some way). Water is a necessity in



our lives, but it is also a great gift. It is water that was used to claim us as God's own children through baptism. As we were baptized into Christ, we received the gift of eternal life – which is a life NOT filled with busyness, but one filled with peace.

Both of these point us to open our eyes to make room in our lives for the peace of God that comes to us through Christ. So as we continue through summer, PLEASE remember to make room for EMPTINESS in your lives so that you can fully IMMERSE yourself in the presence of God and the peace that is only found in Christ.

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Ten minutes... ten minutes before... ten minutes after.... What can happen in just ten minutes?

Ten minutes before our church service you can greet visitors and make them feel welcomed. Introduce yourself. Answer a question. Invite them to sit with you.

Ten minutes after our church service you can greet them again. Invite them to join you for coffee in the parish hall. Invite them to Soulful conversations or Sunday School. Make sure they know where the Sunday School classes are for the children.

Next week, greet them again. Get to know a little more about them. Tell them a little more about you. Invite them to lunch. Invite them to an event at CTK. Make them feel welcomed.

The following week, do it all over again. Introduce them to other members they may not have met yet. Invite them to become part of our congregation.

The ten minutes before and after each service are significant times for our guests. Friendliness must be constantly practiced. Each week, several people visit our congregation for the first time. Extend your hand. Put on a smile. Let's be friendly. The assigned greeters are not the only people that should be greeting our visitors. If only one or two people interact with our visitors, how likely is it that they will want to return?

Ten minutes... ten minutes before... ten minutes after.... What can happen in just ten minutes?



"Serving Neighbors Near and Far, And in all we do, growing disciples for Christ"

We are committed to continuously serve our neighbors near and far, and during the past year the stewardship committee has focused on our "ministry beyond the parking lot". As the body of Christ in this place, we continue to serve others in our community, state, country, and around the world. In so doing we reach out and touch the lives of millions.

Just Look What Has Been Done. The ELCA is now in its second year of its first-ever comprehensive campaign, *Always Being Made New*, and has brought exciting growth. In 2015, support from individuals, congregations, and others provided financial support for "neighbors near and far." Shown below is a summary of activities supported in the 2015 campaign and the results of generous donors.

- · 62 new-start ministries in the ELCA
- · 235 seminary students received an ELCA Fund for Leaders Scholarship during the academic year
- 73 young adults in Global Missions were sent into a year of service
- 6 international women received a full-tuition scholarship in the 2015-2016 academic year
- 34 international women participated in an International Women Leaders seminar in Wittenberg,
 Germany
- · 224 missionaries were supported
- 14 malaria programs in Africa received support from the ELCA Malaria Campaign
- 60 countries around the world received ELCA World Hunger-supported programs
- 17 "renewing" congregations received grants in the 2015 campaign
- · 21 new or enhanced youth and young adult ministries received grants during the year

As the Rev. Elizabeth A. Eaton, presiding bishop of the ELCA has stated, "This is exciting news about the campaign. At a time when people are concerned about contracting resources, we see the generosity of our members expanding. At a time when some wonder if the church has the capacity to be engaged in the world, we are actually extending our work. Truly, together we can do more".

At CTK we are committed to serve neighbors near and far, and we are blessed to have the opportunity. By continuing to work together, we can accomplish great things in "growing disciples for Christ".
