Cornucopia of Blessings



When I was growing up, my mom always placed a cornucopia with a variety of (fake) fruits and vegetables on our living room coffee table to decorate for November and Thanksgiving. The cornucopia or “horn of plenty” is a symbol of abundance and nourishment and it originates from classical antiquity. As our theme for the year reminds us, we have blessings as many as the stars. We have a cornucopia of blessings and we are called to be a blessing for the world. All that being said, this month I am going to deal with a cornucopia (in this sense meaning a wide variety) of items.

If you haven't already noticed, we have moved our united reading of our Mission Statement to the end of our worship services. This was intentional and is meant to be a reminder of what our mission is – what we are called to do and be – for the week ahead as we leave worship re-energized and re-focused to do the work of God's kingdom.

If you haven't noticed the maps in the Fellowship Hall, go take a look. This is a prayer station that **EVERYONE** is invited to continually add to. The idea is that you place a star sticker (found there by the maps) on the map for those places where you pray blessings will happen, give thanks for blessings that have already happened there or pray blessings for your friends or family located at that place. If we need more star stickers, please let the church office know.

You may have noticed the pew that was up on the chancel has been removed when we installed the new flooring. We intentionally left it out to allow flexibility in the chancel area and to allow the stained glass windows up there to be more visible. This pew was moved into the Fellowship Hall to be used for extra seating over there. On a related note, you have probably also noticed that I and the other worship leaders do not sit up in the chancel area. The purpose behind this is a visual realization that **ALL** of us are involved in worship. It is NOT meant to be something that I (as the pastor) lead and y'all watch like an audience. Worship involves all of us. The word “liturgy” means “work of the people”. The Danish philosopher and theologian, Soren Kierkegaard, once said, “People have an idea that the preacher is an actor on a stage and they are the critics, blaming or praising him. What they don't know is that they are the actors on the stage; the preacher is merely the prompter standing in the wings, reminding them of their lost lines.” By sitting together, it is another reminder that we are the Body of Christ and we work together in accomplishing God's ministry.

As we enter into this month of Thanksgiving, I am so extremely thankful for each and every one of you. I count each of you as a blessing in my life and I give thanks for you just as St. Paul wrote to the Philippians (1:3-6). “I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ. “





ADULT BIBLE STUDY – meets in the Choir Room

Sunday at 9:15am –We will begin a new plan for Sunday mornings based on the Lectionary readings. The Scripture texts we use in worship are based on a rotating three year cycle of selected readings and this is called the “Lectionary” (or more formally the “RCL” or “Revised Common Lectionary”). In the Adult Sunday School class, we will be looking at the Lectionary reading for the upcoming Sunday. (So we’ll be a week ahead of the worship readings.) We will be taking a deeper look at ALL four readings instead of just focusing on one as Pastor Mike does in the sermon. Everyone is welcome and all you need to do is bring your Bible.

Every second Sunday of the month, we will discuss a story from the Living Lutheran magazine (available in the narthex/church lobby). So grab some food from the Parish Hall and bring it to the choir room to join the conversation on those days.

Wednesday at 10:30am – We are looking at “The Present Future: Six Tough Questions for the Church” by Reggie McNeal. This curriculum invites us to look at the new realities that churches must face as we move/look into the future. Everyone is also invited to join us for lunch following the Bible study at La Fiesta Patio Mexican café on Pat Booker.

SALT – Spirited Adults Learning Together

Dip into the Word of God for spice in your spiritual life. Join us Wednesday evenings at 6pm in Room 2 of the Parish Hall building. We will also be looking at the Lectionary as mentioned above. So, bring your Bible and a friend to see how it impacts our lives. This is an opportunity for adult conversation and study; to be “salty” Christians in our life and in our world. No need to RSVP, just show up—but bring your bible. **EVERYONE IS WELCOME!**

Stewardship Committee Report—November, 2016

What Will We Offer Back to God?

I came across the following article a few days ago and want to share with you.

“Suppose you borrow a pencil from a friend, you grind it down in a pencil sharpener to nothing but a handful of shavings, and then give it back to your friend, saying, “Thanks for the loan of the pencil. Here it is.”

His reaction might well be, “You’ve got to be kidding!” If he finds you are serious, he might question your sanity. If he believes you are sane, he has every right to be disappointed at your ingratitude.

But look, how have we treated God? How have we used his good gifts”? We have polluted air, dirtied water, strip-mined land, and abused most things. And what about God’s gifts of human potential—the spiritual, emotional, intellectual, and physical gifts each of us has received?

We keep before us the fact that stewardship is about things that do not belong to us. What do we do with the gifts of God? The gift becomes the task. There is a sense of urgency that we must be stewards of the Gospel, of the friendship of God; an urgency of opportunity of giving thanks to God, for returning to God that which is God’s alone.

Stewardship solved the problems of the early church and it should be an inspiration for us. Holy Scripture makes it clear that God gives back to us what we give to him. God is not a taker in any area. He is a giver in all areas. Jesus said, “Give and it shall be given to you. For with the same measure that you give, it shall be measured to you”. (Lk 6:38).

We pray that we may grow together in the stewardship of our lives, and always remember what we are about, i.e. ***“Serving Neighbors Near and Far, and in all we do, growing disciples for Christ”***


A special thank you to Kendra Peterson and Al Boos IV who took over Middle School / High School while Mariesa was out of town.


BREAD FOR THE DAY 2017:
