I recently started reading a book from Barbara Brown Taylor called “An Altar in the World: A Geography of Faith”. So far, I have been quite intrigued by it, but this is really no shock since I have enjoyed Barbara Brown Taylor’s previous work. As we have enjoyed a beautiful Spring (even though somewhat severe weather-wise) and are looking ahead to Summer with its change of pace and varying activities, I wanted to share a passage from the book.

“I must have been sixteen, earning summer spending money by keeping a neighbor’s cats while she was away. The first time I let myself into the house, the fleas leapt on my legs like airborne piranha. Brushing them off as I opened cat food and cleaned litter pans, I finally fled through the back door with the bag of trash my employer had left for me to carry to the cans out back. I could hear the fleas inside flinging themselves against the plastic, so that it sounded as if a light rain were falling inside the bag.

I could not wait to be shed of it. On my way to the cans, I passed a small garden area off to the left that was not visible from the house. Glancing at it, I got the whole dose of loveliness at once - the high arch of trees above, the mossy flagstones beneath, the cement birdbath, the cushiony bushes, the white wrought-iron chair – all lit by stacked planes of sunlight that turned the whole scene golden. It was like a door to another world. I had to go through it. I knew that if I did, then I would become golden too.

But first I had to ditch the bag. The fleas popped against the plastic as I hurried to the big aluminum garbage cans near the garage. Stuffing the bags into one of them, I turned back toward the garden, fervent to explore what I had only glimpsed in passing. When I got there, the light had changed. All that was left was a little overgrown sitting spot that no one had sat in for years. The smell of cat litter drifted from the direction of the garbage cans. The garden was no longer on fire.



‘I think it ticks God off if you walk by the color purple in a field and don’t notice it,’ says Shug Avery, one of the wise women in Alice Walker’s book “The Color Purple”. I noticed the color gold, but I did not turn aside. I had a bag full of fleas to attend to. While I made that my first priority, the fire moved on in search of someone who would stop what she was doing, take off her shoes and say, ‘Here am I.’” (pgs. 25-6)



As we face the many activities of Summer and the family vacations, we don’t want to miss the opportunities God places before us; opportunities to become golden and be a part of a garden on fire or to see God’s handiwork in a field of purple – chances to admire the beauty of a nice evening or enjoy the company of great friends. You’ve probably heard the saying “Each day is a gift. That is why it’s called the present.” Even as cliché or sappy as it may seem, it is true. Each and every day has been given to us by God to enjoy. God is trying to catch our attention and help us find those moments of true, lasting beauty in life. Take the time to find those glimpses of “another world”. Be sure to stop your hurried or busy momentum and relish what God is offering you, then say “Here am I!” and don’t forget to add “Thank you, Lord!”

Do you read the posts on the Southwestern Texas Synod's FaceBook page? Did you see the article they shared from [www.ministrymatters.com](http://www.ministrymatters.com) about the offering plate?

It was an interesting approach to giving. The article addressed how "old fashioned" cash and checkbooks have become. Many people have stopped carrying them and instead use debit or credit cards everywhere they go. Why should we expect people to remember their cash or checkbooks on Sunday when they don't use them any other time of the week?

The article continued to encourage churches to come into the "here and now" and leave some of our past behind us. There are churches that now use a "credit card receiving device that allows people the sacrament of paying their offerings." Other members give tithes, pledges, and offerings online or by direct deposit. People seem to like giving that way.


I don't know if we're ready for an offering kiosk in the narthex, but we need to make sure everyone is aware of online giving options at CTK. First, we have a place to give online on our website. You can even set up recurring, automatic donations. Second, you can participate in Simply Giving which is endorsed by Thrivent. I believe we have several members participating in this method. Lastly, many people pay their bills electronically through their bank. You can make your donations through that same process.

The article made me think: Are there other updates we can make that maintain our traditions, but bring them into the "here and now?" We've done that with the gluten free wafers for communion and the disposal baskets for communion cups. What else can we do? Could we project our bulletins and do away with the paper version? Wonder how much money we'd save in the long run?

I love our organ and traditional hymns, but I also enjoy the more contemporary songs played on the Kurzweil. And when the sounds of the other instruments are added, it makes it all the more special. Do we need to offer a traditional service and a contemporary one? Can we blend the two together?

What else can we do? I know! We can pray! That never goes out of style. Please remember to keep CTK – our members, our staff, and volunteers – and our country in your prayers.
