In this month when we especially celebrate love because of Valentine's Day, I thought we should have some quotes from Martin Luther that also deal with love.

The first I found is this: "The whole being of any Christian is faith and love. Faith brings the person to God, love brings the person to people." This is such a great reminder of how intricately connected faith and love are. Our faith is indeed connecting us to God and God's love which pours into our lives. And that love from God connects us with other people – helping us form relationships and serving each other out of love. As we know, the "love" portrayed during Valentine's Day isn't realistic. A quote I like and have used in wedding sermons is "Love is the generic name used for specific actions of patient and costly service to others."¹ Real love gets beyond the pretty and the polite.

One of the blogs I read is by Dr. Kelly Flanagan and he beautifully gets at this. He wrote, "Somewhere along the way, my wife and I finally figured out that broken people cannot live in a Hallmark-holiday. Because with living, breathing, broken people, too much stuff happens. Old wounds get touched. Old emotional splinters work their way to the surface. Old habits get reenacted. ... *Real* love happens when you quit *resisting* this brokenness and, instead, *reveal* it to the person you love."²

The thing is this brokenness happens in communities too. When we are in relationship with people, our brokenness is revealed and our "real" life shows up. Even so, we portray our love for one another in those specific acts of patient and costly service to each other. We portray our love in revealing our brokenness. The second quote from Luther on love gets at this. He said, "Faith, like light, should always be simple and unbending; while love, like warmth, should beam forth on every side and bend to every necessity of our brethren." Here again, we're hearing how love involves service.

So as our culture goes overboard in celebrating a Hallmark kind of love, I hope you feel love like Luther mentioned – warm and beaming forth on every side. And I hope you offer love that helps meet the needs of your family, friends and neighbors.

"I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?" Isaiah 43:19a

As we approach Lent this year, I am reminded that "fasting" has a long tradition in history. It has two meanings. The most popular definition is to "give something up" for Lent, whether that be chocolate or Facebook. The other is not as well-known but is about "holding fast" to something, like your prayer discipline or family life.

In our Synod's communication, we are giving up and holding fast beginning in February, and there will be a "new thing." After 165 years of printed synod news, last month was the last edition of the Vista newspaper. It was difficult to give up this historical, printed Vista mailed to members homes, but costs kept increasing and the editor, John Dellis, couldn't continue due to demands at his new job at the Lutheran Foundation of the Southwest (Thanks, John, for your years of service!)



However, we wanted to hold fast to keeping good communication within the synod, so "more frequent communication at less cost" seemed the wisest way of making this change.

Therefore, VISTAlite was born, a monthly insert for congregational newsletters that provides an opportunity for celebrating some events and anticipating others. Pastor Julie Rowe, the synod's Communications Coordinator, will be the editor.

This communication tool complements the weekly eNews that provides shorter-term updates on events and happenings. Anyone can register for eNews by going to the synod website at www.swtsynod.org and clicking on the eNews icon on the bottom right of that page.

As for Lent, I have until Ash Wednesday, Feb 14, to decide if I will give something up, hold fast to something or do both. Since Ash Wednesday will be Valentine's Day. I doubt I will be giving up chocolate!

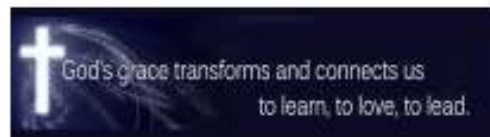
LEGACIES BRING NEW LIFE

THE FEEDING OF THE 2500 AT ST MARK, ADKINS

The feast is over and the BBQ pits cooled, but the inspiration and lessons learned from St Mark's benefit BBQ for the shooting incident at Sutherland Springs are there for the taking. This small church ignited 2500 people to attend and over 11,000 interested on Facebook to donate over \$90,000 for the cause. Why and how?

The Spirit ignited a spark in young people with a fledgling BBQ ministry—and other members of St. Mark. It caught fire with the dedication of community young people who wanted to make a difference. 500 people responded to volunteer—working 7 days straight with BBQ pits from as far away as Louisiana to serve 700 lbs of meat that day. We can fuel our mission by reaching out to the people and gifts already in our communities through partnerships to touch a heartfelt need!

LUTHERAN LEGISLATIVE EVENT: LOVING YOUR NEIGHBOR THROUGH ADVOCACY

This year's 2018 Lutheran Legislative Event is sponsored by the SWT Synod's Poverty and Justice Task Force (PJTF) in partnership with Texas Impact. The theme is "Rooted in Faith/Grounded in Love," based on Ephesians 3:14-21. The event will be held at Gethsemane Lutheran, Austin. The event opens at 2:00 pm on Sunday, Feb 11, and concludes at the Texas State Capitol about 1 pm on Tuesday, Feb 13.

This year's agenda focuses on the biblical and theological mandates for justice in legislation, to "act justly and love mercy." Rev. Alexia Salvatierra, an ordained ELCA pastor who trains people throughout the US in the principles and methods of faith-rooted organizing, will provide the inspiration throughout Sunday afternoon/evening.

Texas Impact and John B. Johnson from the ELCA Washington D.C. Advocacy Office will lead Monday's program on advocacy and preparing for visiting legislators, which takes place Tuesday.

IMPORTANT FEBRUARY CONFERENCE MEETINGS

Throughout February the eight conferences of the synod will be having special meetings. Along with conference business, there will be a presentation on behalf of the Strategic Planning Task Force about the synod's new Purpose Statement: God's grace transforms and connects us to learn, to love, to lead! There will also be a report on "Congregations Cooperating Together" and everyone will be encouraged to identify nominees for various elections - Ministry Team chairs for the Mission Team and the Leadership Development Team, Synod Council, 2019 Churchwide Assembly voting members, Discipline and Consultation Committees, and two nominees for the ELCA Church Council.

One particularly significant item is the pre-identification process for potential nominees for the bishop's election at the Synod Assembly on May 5-6. All members of a congregation of that conference may take part in this process. The goal of this process is to lift-up names of pastors who may have the gifts to serve as the next bishop of the synod. As each conference completes this process, the Elections Committee will contact all those named and ask if they would like to submit a photo and bio for the assembly website. Voting members to the assembly can then read that information in order to be better informed as they attend the assembly and go through the ecclesiastical ballot for the bishop's election. Stewardship Message, February, 2018

The Man in the Mirror

During the past year the theme of the stewardship committee has focused on **Stewardship of Self**, and how can we grow and best respond to God's invitation for service in our faith journey.

So perhaps we should do some self-examination, ask the tough questions, and see where we stand. Having given this some thought, I determined that a self-analysis can best be accomplished by looking in the mirror and having a conversation with oneself. So, here goes.

Me—I confess my sins, receive forgiveness, hear God's Word, sing hymns, listen to the sermon, give an offering, receive communion, receive the sending blessing, and go home.

Mirror—How serious are you in following up on what you confess, i.e., sing, listen, etc.?

Me—To myself--Uh Oh!. I can see where this guy is going. He wants to see how I am doing in my spiritual growth, i.e. my "**Stewardship of Self**".

Me—I told him I especially like to sing.

Mirror—That's great, So, what are some of your favorite hymns?

Me—I especially like:

Stand Up, Stand Up for Jesus, and
I Love to Tell the Story

Mirror—I assume you know that singing is like talking, meaning that it is assumed that you believe what you sing, just like you believe what you say. So, when is the last time you stood up for Jesus, or told His story? I mean to someone other than a fellow church member?.

Me—I said Uh-Oh, and started to squirm a little. At that point, I said, well, it's about time to leave for church. (at this point I was glad the clock was on my side because I could tell I was experiencing the beginning of a guilt trip). So I thanked the man in the mirror for sharing his thoughts and I left for church. As I was driving down Pat Booker Road, and thinking about my encounter with the man in the mirror, it became obvious that I have a lot of opportunity for improvement in my **Stewardship of Self**. Perhaps we should all have a look at the person in the mirror.
