to sell on Saturday. **Don't forget to drop by on Saturday to shop for yourself!!**

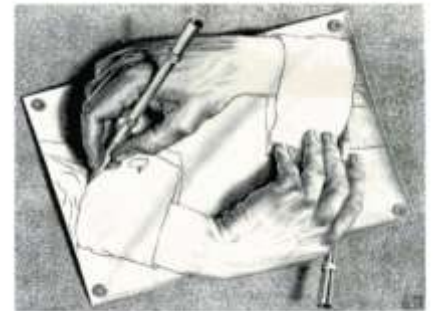

I mentioned in one of my sermons a quote in my office – “Sometimes when you’re in a dark place you think you’ve been buried, but actually you’ve been planted” (from Christine Caine). But right below this quote is another one by Martin Luther which says, “Our Lord has written the promise of resurrection ... in every leaf in springtime.” As we are in the midst of springtime here in South Texas and seeing new life (and over abundant pollen) burst forth everywhere, this quote seems all too appropriate. Even so, it is such a great reminder for us – especially as we celebrate Easter.

One of the reasons I love gardening and yardwork is because it is so easy to see God’s hand at work there, but it is also remarkable to see the rebirth in springtime. Creation rested and was renewed during the winter, but springtime marks its awakening and rebirth. The green of new leaves is different – lighter and brighter – from last year’s growth on the ivy in my neighbor’s yard. The flower buds bursting open on the red bud trees and other plants are miraculous to watch as they seemingly appear and open overnight. It truly is as if all of creation is singing God’s praise and pointing us to the message of resurrection which we receive because of Christ’s sacrifice.



When I lived in Nebraska and Minnesota, one of the hardest things was to not have the natural greenery and new life all around as we celebrated Easter; because of course, it was still cold (and sometimes still even snow covered) up there. There is just something about seeing the earth come to life again that speaks so deeply to the promise of resurrection and eternal life which has been made to us by God through Jesus the Christ. You can’t help but give thanks! I hope and pray you have been able to witness God’s promise of resurrection in some small way this springtime.

Finance Committee Report

This is part 2 of a 2 part report. Part 1 was included in the March newsletter.

At the annual congregational meeting held in January, and as required by the constitution, we received and discussed the reports from the various ministry groups. Questions were asked and observations made regarding the form and content of the information included in the annual report document.

Your finance committee has determined that additional information and clarification would be beneficial, to both those members attending the meeting as well as those who were not able to be there. We prepared a report which included a summary of the financial results for 2017 and a comparison to the 2017 budget and actual results in 2016. Also shown was our cash position at December 31, 2017 and 2016. This information was included in the March newsletter. Shown below is additional information which, due to space limitations, was not included.

Accounting System:

We use the Shepherds Staff accounting system. This system, primarily designed for use by churches and other non-profit organizations, provides several modules, including cash receipts and disbursements, individual member contributions, membership roll, attendance register, budget, pledges, and others.

Income and expense items are entered via an account number and account title assigned to that ministry group and specific account within it. When data is entered, the system provides for roll-ups, meaning that reports are generated to provide footprints on the source of the data. The information is available at any time, and may be reported at a base level or in summary report form. Detailed reports are rolled up from the initial data entry to various levels within each ministry group, and then summarized into a combined report of all activity. These reports are given to the church council on a monthly basis for review.

Audit Committee:

As was mentioned in the meeting, our constitution requires us have an annual audit of the books of the congregation. We are blessed to have a group of dedicated volunteers who give of their time to serve on this very important committee. The report of the committee is presented to the council for their review and action as necessary.

Let us keep in mind that the function of the audit committee is to ensure that the books are maintained in accordance with established accounting principles, that cash receipts and disbursements are recorded in accordance with procedure, and that cash and other assets are properly safeguarded and controlled.

The audit committee is not responsible for the preparation and reporting of financial statements. This is the responsibility of the treasurer.

Conclusion:

As stated in the March newsletter, it is our hope that you will find this information helpful regarding the preparation, reporting, and analysis of our financial statements.

We are extremely fortunate and blessed that our books are well maintained and in good hands. Our treasurer, Dale Meyers, and our financial secretary, Leona Hietala, have faithfully performed their tasks for many years. These are unpaid, volunteer positions. They spend many hours each week in making sure that our cash receipts and disbursements are properly accounted for, and that member's contributions are promptly and properly recorded. We owe each of them a big debt of gratitude.

Thank you for allowing us to review and address some of the questions and/or comments surfaced at the annual meeting. Your stewardship and finance committee will be pleased to answer any questions and provide additional information as necessary.
