In the movie “Black Panther”, King T’challa says, “In times of crisis, the wise build bridges, while the foolish build barriers. We must find a way to look after one another as if we were one single tribe.” This actually comes from a Nigerian proverb and there is such great beauty and deep meaning within it. Back in March, I used a quote from Martin Luther wherein he said, “God does not need your good works, but your neighbor does.” I think this gets at some of what the Nigerian proverb is addressing. Martin Luther also said, “A religion that gives nothing, costs nothing, and suffers nothing, is worth nothing.” We must step out in faith and meet the neighbors and all those beyond to see how we can form relationships to better this world for everyone!

BIG CHANGES IN THE SANCTUARY

SYNOD ASSEMBLY HIGHLIGHTS

The Southwestern Texas Synod Assembly was held on May 4 thru 6 at the Embassy Suites in San Marcos. Pastor Mike Widner, Sally Walters, Don and Margaret Vogt represented Christ the King at the Assembly. The following action was taken:

We elected Bishop's Associate, Pastor Sue Briner, as the next Bishop of the Southwestern Texas Synod. She will be installed on September 1 at 2:00 p.m. at University United Methodist Church in San Antonio.

Prayer shawls used for the bishop's election were made by volunteers across the synod. An extra prayer shawl was sent with Deacon Sue Rothmeyer for Presiding Bishop Eaton.

San Pablo Lutheran Church, San Antonio, was accepted as a new congregation to the synod.

We elected persons to synod leadership positions. (See What's Happening bulletin board for a list of those elected.)

On Saturday we enjoyed a farewell banquet for Bishop Ray and Debbie Tiemann. The assembly celebrated the gifts received for the Tiemann Endowment Fund for Leadership Development in the amount of \$57,170. Gifts are always welcome, and the 2019 assembly offering has been designated for the Tiemann Endowment.

An assembly offering for the synod's account in Fund for Leaders (supporting seminary scholarships) of \$69,255.23 was received.

The assembly approved a resolution entitled, "Recognizing and Responding to the Status of Jerusalem, the City over which Jesus Wept." It encourages congregations to use the ELCA's "Peace Not Walls" resources to learn about elements that lead to peace and to utilize travel to Israel and Palestine, listening to all voices, to learn firsthand the complex issues of conflict and peace in that region.

The 2019 Synod Assembly will be held on May 31 to June 2 at the Bayfront Omni Hotel in Corpus Christi.



*S*pirited FAITH – June 13th and June 27th, 6pm

Everyone is invited to join in on some "spirited" faith discussions beginning at 6pm (but you can arrive later) on June 13th and June 27th (and on other dates throughout the summer). Stewardship Committee Message—June, 2018

*“The world asks, ‘What does a man own?’
Christ asks, ‘How does he use it?’”*

Sometimes one never knows how the Holy Spirit impacts a person’s life, and as our vision statement proclaims, in part, “leading to faith”. I compare this to tossing a rock into a pond and watching the ripples spread ever outward. You never know where it will end.

I would like to share a letter which I received many years ago when I served as the corporate controller of my employer. When my secretary brought in my mail one morning, she said “you may want to pay attention to the letter on top of the stack”. It is shown below. I have elected to withhold some of the information.

*“Dear Sir,
Please accept this check for \$_____.*

Four years ago, during the Christmas season, I stole a _____ from one of your outlets in _____. This also includes interest at 10% for the year. I have since that time found the Lord Jesus Christ as my personal savior, and have received forgiveness from God for my sins. But I believe it is up to me, as far as I am able, to recompense and rectify the transgressions which I have made to my fellow man.

I hope this will reimburse you for the loss that I caused you, and I sincerely hope that you could find it in your heart to forgive me for the evil which I have done towards you. May God bless you in all goodness.”

We may ask how does this event relate to stewardship? I think that somewhere, at some time, someone used their time and talents to “toss the rock” into the spiritual pond. One of the ripples reached this man’s heart. We never know how far our “ripples” will go, but it is only through sharing our resources that we do what our Lord has commanded. In this case, as in countless others, someone shared a talent, time, and/or used their financial resources to plant a seed in this man’s heart. A rock was tossed into the pond and started the ripple effect, and as we say, the rest is history.

I have often wondered what this man’s life was after he wrote this letter and enclosed the check. One thing for sure—the Spirit led him to repentance and he asked for forgiveness.

Things like this happen when we work together, and by doing so, we can accomplish great things. As Thomas Edison once said, “If we did all the things we are capable of doing, we would absolutely astonish ourselves”

And so, as we go forward, let us “absolutely astonish ourselves” by sharing our time, talents, and treasures.
