When we typically think of May, Mother’s Day comes to mind, as well as Memorial Day, Cinco de Mayo and of course, high school and college graduations. I know it has been said before in regards to graduation that it is not an ending per se, but a new beginning (hence it being called a “commencement” address because something is commencing). And while I realize that the majority of us are not “graduating”, it is still a good time for reflection on this idea.

With this in mind, I thought of two quotes from Martin Luther. First, he said, “A Christian is never in a state of completion but always in a process of becoming.” That is a great reminder about how we never stop growing and learning. The Faith Formation section of the newsletter asks “Are you ready to grow?” because it is important for EVERYONE to actively pursue growth opportunities, especially in regards to our spiritual lives. We can quite easily become complacent and think “I don’t need to attend Bible Study or learn anything new about faith. I already know God loves me and that is enough!” We are always in a process of becoming better and one of the easiest ways to do that is through Bible study and discussion with others. One of my favorite passages comes from Proverbs 27:17, “As iron sharpens iron, so one person sharpens another.” We help each other grow. We point out new ideas to one another in Scripture and in our faith that we may not have ever seen on our own.

Luther also said, “This life is not righteousness, but growth in righteousness; not health, but healing; not being, but becoming; not rest but exercise. We are not yet what we shall be, but we are growing toward it. The process is not yet finished, but it is going on. This is not the end, but it is the road. All does not yet gleam in glory, but all is being purified.” We are growing, healing, becoming and exercising. “We are not yet what we shall be, but we are growing toward it.” A popular saying is “God loves you just the way you are, but refuses to leave you that way.” We are constantly changing and encouraged to continue the search of becoming better – better (closer) in our relationship to God (and others), better in understanding God’s will for ourselves and the world, better in our use of resources and treatment of others, better in whatever way you think you may need.

I hope and pray that you will find some Bible study, discussion group or even simply a friendship that helps you to grow in your faith and spiritual life.

CELEBRATING THE TIEMANN'S 35 YEARS IN ORDAINED MINISTRY

By Aug. 31—Bishop Tiemann's final day of service as Bishop—he will have served three terms (18 years) as the chief pastor of the synod. His entire public ordained ministry of 35 years was spent in this synod, serving Abiding Savior, Cameron and Holy Ghost, Fredericksburg until his election as the fourth bishop of the synod in 2000. In addition to his work and ministry as Bishop, he has served as a member of the Texas Lutheran University Corporation board and the boards of Wartburg Theological Seminary and Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago. The Tiemann Endowment Fund, managed by the Lutheran Foundation of the Southwest, has been created to honor the Tiemanns' service and will provide grants into perpetuity for leadership development for lay leaders, deacons and pastors.



Rev. Jessica Cain was installed on March 18 as pastor of Living Word Lutheran in Buda.

Pastor Jessica is currently also serving as the synod's Children, Youth, and Family Coordinator.



Things are progressing for Pastor Rosemarie Doucette to be called to serve as a Global Mission pastor at ILCO, the Synod's Companion church in Costa Rica. The plan is for her to serve in their ministries and strengthen our connection with them. She says she is fixing up the guestroom and you are welcome! GET READY FOR ASSEMBLY 2018!

For everything you need to know about the 2018 Southwestern Texas Synod Assembly, please visit www.swtsynod.org/assembly2018. Here are some highlights:

- 1) Information on Potential Nominees for Bishop will be available March 31. Please read through this information, and note that it will not be available online after April 27 so the assembly can begin with an open, ecclesiastical ballot. The Elections Committee is providing the resources found on www.swtsynod.org/bishopselection to help members of the SWT Synod prayerfully reflect on our life together, our hopes for the future, and our upcoming election of a new bishop. This is a strategic moment in which we can act on our new Purpose Statement: "God's grace transforms and connects us to learn, to love, to lead". Use the page to inform and prepare yourself for the deliberations of the assembly.
- 2) The assembly offering this year will go toward the synod's account in Fund for Leaders to support seminarians. For more info see www.swtsynod.org/programoffering
- 3) All are welcome to participate in worship, and visitors may attend plenary sessions after signing-in as observers. Seating is limited. We also plan to livestream the synod assembly, so stay tuned for details.
- 4) The Bulletin of Reports will initially be available online beginning April 5 with documents added as they are available. The Guidebook App will provide access after that date.

NEW LATINO MINISTRY IN THE VALLEY

The Rio Grande Valley is home to a million people, 85 percent of whom are Latino. The Synod Council has approved a proposal by the Synod's DEM, Pastor Judith Spindt, that creates the Rio Grande Valley as a Latino Mission Field. Funding for this project to have a missionary in the Valley will happen with Synod Council support, an ELCA grant and restricted synod funds for Latino ministry. Pastor Alma Morales was called and began her ministry February 1.



The goal is to establish 10 faith formation groups throughout the Valley, some in colonias and others around existing Lutheran congregations, such as Our Savior, McAllen; First, Edinburg; Good Shepherd, Elsa and Trinity, Mission. Pastor Alma is creating outreach curriculum to train leaders for mission outreach. [Contact Pastor Judith](#) to see how your congregation can be a part of this exciting effort.
