### **Update from Missional River Team**

Is the Missional River team still meeting? Is their work completed? What was the result? It has been a while since the congregation was last updated on our progress and we thought it was time to share our accomplishments thus far. We have been busy listening to three specific sources: the word of God, the congregation and the community. We have now begun the process of sorting through what we have heard.

We began the work of the team by listening to God through scripture and prayer, a process which we continue to practice. Three of the main themes we found frequently repeated in the scriptures we have studied are a sense of wonder, an ability to listen openly and involvement or participation.

We then moved on to listening to the congregation. This was accomplished using an assessment, a survey, and by meeting with many individuals in focus groups. The three main themes that became evident through this process are: the importance of tradition and our identity as Lutherans, a sense of contentment, and a love for children and concern for their needs.

Finally, we needed to become better acquainted with the needs and concerns of those who live and work in the area surrounding the church. Therefore, our final group to listen to was composed of leaders in the surrounding communities and members of the neighborhood. This was accomplished by face to face interviews with the leaders and by hosting a free community BBQ here at the church. The three main concerns which we feel were expressed by this group were food insecurity, the needs of children, and the needs of seniors.

Although we have accomplished much, our task is very far from over. Now that we have gathered all this information, what does all this mean for Christ the King Lutheran Church? We ask you to lift these findings in prayer and we invite you to tell us where you see the Holy Spirit at work in these items and/or anywhere you feel the Spirit is leading us.

## Stewardship Committee Message—July, 2018

## STEWARDSHIP OF SELF: USE MY LIFE

Psalm 91:1-2, 9-16. My refuge and my fortress; my God, in whom I trust. V.2

TRUST ME! How often have we heard this remark or how often have we used it. Or, Trust me on this, I know what I'm doing (or saying). How often do we fall into this verbal slang type of communication? It seems that asking others to put their trust in me is perhaps an indication of my insecurity or that we are trying to persuade others to do something that is important only to me.

I remember well a situation several years ago when I had asked a person to do a task one day which would allow me to continue the next day to complete the work. The other person's work was intended to make my work the following day much easier. I had trusted the individual and his ability to complete a rather simple task. I asked if he had any questions regarding the work; he indicated that he understood fully. Great! My next work day was going to be a breeze, so I thought. The next day came and to my surprise the preliminary work was not completed as specified. The project took twice as long as I had planned. What to do? Well, I had to do it; get the job done and move on! Could this person be trusted to do more work for me when asked? Perhaps, but as it turned out, he was marginally trust worthy. Some days his work was better than other days, no consistency.

We read about the word Trust in the bible. During the Season of Lent, the first Sunday in fact, when Jesus is tempted by the devil to feed himself followed by other tempting challenges, he rebuked the devil by Trusting God with his life. He trusted the word of God as the source for his life and not the temptations offered by the devil. Can we do the same in rebuking the many temptations which perhaps come upon us daily? We can only if we heed the word of God and follow his direction. In Psalm 91 we have assurances that God is with us at all times. We need to trust in him even if we don't trust others. Coupling trust with faith could ease our minds when working with others. We need to have faith that our friends and/or fellow workers will fulfill their duties and obligations without worry on our part. Trust Me!
