In the preface to his commentary on Romans, Martin Luther wrote, “Faith is a work of God in us, which changes us and brings us to birth anew from God. It kills the old Adam, makes us completely different people in heart, mind, senses, and all our powers, and brings the Holy Spirit with it. What a living, creative, active powerful thing is faith! It is impossible that faith ever stop doing good. Faith doesn’t ask whether good works are to be done, but before it is asked, it has done them. It is always active.”

Faith changes us. It is something that (hopefully) continues to help us grow throughout the whole of our lives. I am not the same person as I was fifteen years ago and that is a good thing! I continue to grow and learn and change and I pray my faith continues to grow as well. A few months ago, I started listening to a podcast about the Enneagram and I found it enlightening, funny, and enjoyable. I’ve heard about the Enneagram in all my different church circles of friends and colleagues for many years, but had never pursued learning more about it. In the short amount of time spent with it so far, I have already learned a great deal about myself and so I want to help others do the same. Therefore, we will be exploring the Enneagram in the Wednesday night bible study beginning on August 8<sup>th</sup> using the book by Ian Cron and Suzanne Stabile entitled “The Road Back to You: An Enneagram Journey to Self-Discovery”.

You’re probably saying, “What is the Enneagram?!” “The Enneagram is a model of the human psyche which is principally understood and taught as a typology of nine interconnected personality types.”<sup>1</sup>

The authors of the book have this to say about it all. “Ignorance is bliss—except in self-awareness. What you don’t know about yourself can hurt you—and your relationships, and maybe even how you make your way in the world. It can also keep you in the shallows with God. Do you want help figuring out who you are and why you’re stuck in the same ruts?”

The Enneagram is an ancient personality type system with an uncanny accuracy in describing how human beings are wired, both positively and negatively. In *The Road Back to You*, we forge a unique approach—a practical, comprehensive way of accessing Enneagram wisdom and exploring its connections with Christian spirituality for a deeper knowledge of ourselves, compassion for others, and love for God. Not only will you learn more about yourself, but you will also start to see the world through other people’s eyes, understanding how and why people think, feel and act the way they do.

Beginning with changes you can start making today, the wisdom of the Enneagram can help you take you further along into who you really are—leading you into places of spiritual discovery you would never have found on your own, and paving the way to the wiser, more compassionate person you want to become.

By challenging us to bravely explore who we really are, the Enneagram helps us recognize and overcome self-defeating patterns of behavior and to become our most authentic selves.”<sup>2</sup>

I’m sure many of you have taken personality type tests before, but this is different. In the July 15<sup>th</sup> Express News, Jana Riess happens to write about the Enneagram saying, “It is a personality test, but it’s also so much more: a spiritual tool, a map of self-discovery and a discipline that will *challenge you* with a new awareness of your shadow side.”

I started off with the quote from Luther saying “Faith is a work of God in us.” As we know, so much about us comes from God and so I invite you to join in growing your faith and relationship with God through more self-discovery of who God made you to be. In the podcasts, the authors repeatedly say how the Enneagram helps us be more compassionate with other people. I think now is a time in our history when we could really use extra compassion in the world. Come find out more about the Enneagram at Wednesday night study (Aug 8th at 6pm in the choir room)!

## Stewardship and Finance Committee Report

*“The world asks, ‘What does a man own?’  
Christ asks, ‘How does he use it?’”*

**Mid-Year Financial Update**—Dale has completed the financial statements as of June 30, 2018, and shown below is a summary of results for the 6 months ended June 30, 2018, and a comparison to budget and last year.

You will note that “current” income is approximately \$3,200 better than budget, and about \$3,800 less than what we received for the same 6 month period last year. Our bottom line is about \$5,300 better than budget, but about \$5,800 less than last year.

**Available Cash**—Our available cash (total cash less dedicated funds) as of June 30, 2018 and June 30, 2017 was:

This is an increase of approximately \$14,000 over the same time last year, and for that we are thankful.

**Dedicated Funds**—At June 30, 2018 the balance in the dedicated funds account was \$123,710, which is a slight decrease from the \$127,276 amount on hand at this time last year.

Dedicated Fund accounts with balances in excess of \$5,000 at June 30, 2018 include:

Gift From the Myrtle Boenig Estate	\$ 26,486
Special Projects Fund	\$ 45,385

As we look ahead to the remainder of the year, we are cautiously and prayerfully optimistic that we will achieve our budgeted financial results. We are blessed and thankful for the support of our members and pray that we continue to support our various ministries.

Finally, let us remember, as Dave Ramsey would say, **WE ARE DEBT FREE!**
