One of the email newsletters I receive focused on spiritual practices last month. One point it made was "Sociologists and anthropologists who study culture have found that the USA is the country that values doing the most. So from a very young age, we learn to plan what we are going to do and to evaluate what we have done. It is very difficult to take time to be with God because it looks like we aren't doing anything." This is not new news. I have shared this with y'all before.

With the busyness of our schedules and our culture of constant doing, we can neglect spending intentional time taking care of our spirit and thereby our spiritual lives. I just preached about fear vs. faith and the small steps we can take to move from fear to courage. If you recall, I mentioned a quote from General George Patton who said, "Courage is fear holding on a minute longer." There are times when we don't feel particularly courageous or brave, especially in light of our fears – but HOLD ON for just a moment longer. We have the promise that God will never leave us and that helps to bolster our courage. I also saw a quote from Brene Brown that said, "It takes courage to say yes to rest and play in a culture where exhaustion is seen as a status symbol."

In regards to our spiritual wholeness, we NEED to take intentional moments for rest and play as well as spending time with God (even if it seems as if that time is not "productive"). That same article (I mentioned above) talked about spiritual practices as one of the best ways to help grow our faith. The author talked about how spiritual practices help us deepen our relationship with God by helping us slow down. That seems so incredibly counter-cultural. **AND IT IS!** After all, most everything Jesus did was counter-cultural and he calls us to act that way as well, even (especially) in regards to our spiritual health.



The article went on to mention that one of the easiest ways to include spiritual practices in your daily routine is to use the alarm on your phone. You can use your phone to grow in faith, without any special apps, tools or time consuming efforts. Set an alarm for some time in the morning to go off every day. When the alarm goes off, stop whatever you're doing and pray for just a moment. If you'd like, set another alarm in the middle of the day and do the same thing. Then set an alarm for near the end of the day and when this alarm goes off, stop and think about what gave you joy during the day or something for which you are thankful.

It also mentioned some important reminders or notes.

- If you skip a day or miss an alarm – don't give up. Just start again next time or tomorrow.
- If you are unsure what to pray about, use the Lord's Prayer or check with me for some simple suggestions.
- If you feel weird about this practice or are not sure that you'll keep doing it, ask a friend or family member to join you in this new habit, using the same alarm times. You will always know that you aren't alone.

This simple action really will help. Take time each and every day to pause and pray. Taking time each day to give thanks is a life changing practice. Take time to **BE** with God.

Stewardship Committee Message October, 2018

“The world asks, ‘What does a man own?’

Christ asks, ‘How does he use it?’”

Our message this month comes from the stewardship ministry programs of the ELCA.

“As members of the ELCA we believe that we are freed in Christ to serve and love our neighbor. As a church that is energized by lively engagement in our faith and life, we know that understanding personal and household stewardship is crucial in responding to God’s abundant grace.

Each of us has a unique story, and we are part of a larger story that makes up the ELCA. In the Road to Emmaus story, it is at the household table where Christ is revealed and recognized, where hearts are warmed for greater sharing and generosity. Recognizing God’s story in our own story shapes our lives, identity and choices. When we join with other individuals and households in making daily decisions rooted in the stories of our loving and benevolent God, the result is our increased capacity to give generously and boldly participate in what God is up to in the world.

Our congregation has the opportunity to be a voice that teaches some very different ideas about time, talent and treasure. The practice of generosity takes the support of an entire faith community, conversation between individuals in all generations and a focus on households.

How do we respond to God’s call to serve and love our neighbors? We faithfully ‘*steward*’ the gifts that God has provided so abundantly. Although some think of stewardship as only a financial response to God’s love, stewardship encompasses so much more than money. It is about how we use all that God has entrusted to our care—our time, our talents and our treasures—to love God and neighbors, both inside and outside of the church walls and our homes.

Stewardship, in its simplest form, is the practice of generosity. It is essential to the daily expression of our living. Our role as God’s stewards is one of many dimensions-grateful, responsible, self-sacrificing, willing, sharing, proportionate, committed, regular, genuine, and challenged. By generously giving of ourselves, we discover joy in Christ.”

Let us be faithful and continue our journey so that in all we do, grow disciples for Christ.

Neurofibromatosis Walk

October 13, 2018

Join us as we walk to raise awareness of this not so fun disease. Mariesa, Cade and several others in the congregation have this disease. Children's Tumor Foundation is constantly doing research to end this disease and give hope to children and families ever.

Some statistics: 1 in 3,000 are born with Neurofibromatosis. It is a genetic disorder. You can't "catch it." There is no known cure but there are many successful clinical trials being completed daily that do give hope. There are 3 types of NF.

If you would like to join us, the walk is free this year. You can register with Mariesa. You can even donate money to Children's Tumor Foundation through Mariesa and Christ The King's team. The walk is 2 miles. It is a steep climb but they mark the trail well and being there is half the fun to support the cause.
