MISSIONAL RIVER TEAM HAPPENINGS

To begin this process, we have decided on two new events that we are asking the congregation to participate in.

The first is National Night Out which is being held on Tuesday October 2nd. We are inviting members of the community and the congregation to come and fellowship that evening from 6 pm until 8 pm. We have chosen to serve individual ice cream cups and bottled water to those who come to visit with us. In addition, we are hoping to have a bouncy house for the children and will provide a new or gently used book for each child that attends. We are asking the congregation to help us with donations of ice cream cups and water. Also, any donations of gently used books will be gratefully accepted. If you are interested in helping serve that evening, please let us know. Volunteers are always appreciated! MISSION ENDOWMENT FUND

In 2017, Christ the King was gifted with a bequest from the estate of Myrtle Boenig. The Congregation Council decided that the best use of this money would be to establish a Mission Endowment Fund and appointed a task force to investigate the options and discuss the logistics of such a fund. The setup team has finalized decisions and made recommendations to the council. The setup team has comprised a list of Frequently Asked Questions in regards to the Mission Endowment Fund in hopes of informing the congregation of the details before our Special Congregational Meeting on September 23, 2018 at 9:15am.

We will be holding an educational forum on Sunday, September 19, 2018 at 9:15am to answer any questions about the Mission Endowment Fund. Deacon John Dellis from Lutheran Foundation of the Southwest will be present to also assist in answering questions that day. Please take a moment to read through these Frequently Asked Questions in preparation for the forum and congregational meeting. Copies of this Frequently Asked Questions document are also available in the narthex.

Christ the King Lutheran Church Mission Endowment Fund Frequently Asked Questions

1. What is the Christ the King Lutheran Church Mission Endowment Fund?

It is a long term investment fund which will generate financial distributions to support CTK ministry work. All donations remain within the investment fund. We will use **earnings** that grow from the invested funds for additional CTK ministry work

The mission endowment fund will help the congregation grow and expand its ministry and impact with community partners, ministries of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, and other mission partners with which the congregation is connected.

The fund is designed primarily to be a vehicle to receive legacy (estate) gifts from members and friends of the congregation. Current gifts are also possible for those who wish to make "second-mile" gifts, above and beyond their regular offerings to the congregation.

2. What is the source of the funds which will provide the initial investment?

Christ the King received a bequest from the Myrtle Boenig Estate in the amount of \$26,486.31. Mrs. Boenig was a long time, faithful member of Christ the King. She wished to touch the lives of others, and to encourage others to discover the spirit of God, and opportunities for a faith-filled life. Her wish was that these funds be used to support ministries outside the operating and budgeted activities of the congregation. Therefore, the Congregation Council appointed a committee to review investment opportunities which would support Mrs. Boenig's wishes.

3. Where will the funds be invested?

Mrs. Boenig's gift will be invested in the Endowment Fund of the ELCA Fund A. As of March 31, 2018 there were 1,061 participants in the fund, and the balance in the fund was 727,558,805. ELCA Fund A managers invest to achieve modest principal growth to keep up with inflation, and provide financial resources for mission opportunities. The current distribution rate is 4%; paid quarterly or it may be reinvested. Christ the King will retain ownership of its account within Fund A and determine how the distribution will be shared.

4. How will the fund be accounted for, and who will be responsible for oversight of the fund?

CTK will account for the ELCA Fund A investment as a dedicated fund which will include all income from Fund A and the CTK distributions for ministry work. Dedicated funds are not part of the operating budget.

CTK Congregation Council will appoint a 5 member Endowment Committee, including the Pastor, Council President, and 3 others (not necessarily council members). Excluding Pastor and Council President, the other 3 members will be appointed for 3 year terms with the exception of the first cycle in which 1 member will have a one year term; the second member will have a two year term; and the third member will have a three year term. At the end of their term, individuals can be re-appointed, if Congregation Council so chooses. If a vacancy occurs, Congregation Council will appoint an individual to fill the remainder of the term.

5. What are the fund oversight responsibilities?

A primary responsibility of the Mission Endowment Fund Committee is to encourage gifts to the Christ the King Lutheran Church Mission Endowment Fund through education and promotion of the fund. The committee may use the services of the Southwestern Texas Synod's Regional Gift Planner in assisting members with the best way to include the Mission Endowment Fund in their estate plans and possible current giving.

The Mission Endowment Fund Committee is also responsible for monitoring account growth and distributions received from ELCA Fund A earnings. The committee will seek congregational input and provide recommendations to Congregation Council regarding utilization of Mission Endowment Fund distributions to support CTK ministry work. The committee will provide a quarterly report to Congregation Council and provide a submission for inclusion in the CTK Annual Report to the Congregation.

6. How can contributions be made to the Endowment Fund?

ELCA Fund A requires a minimum of \$2,000 for subsequent deposits. CTK members and friends can make a contribution through envelope giving by simply identifying a dollar amount for "Mission Endowment Fund." When the required \$2,000 minimum is reached, the total donated to that date will be forwarded for deposit into Fund A.

Like Mrs. Boenig, all Christ the King members can include a provision in their will or other legacy plans to provide a legacy gift to the Christ the King Lutheran Church Mission Endowment Fund.
