Today, as I was sitting in a meeting with pastors from around the conference, we started our time together with prayer and then by “Dwelling in the Word”. Dwelling in the Word is a practice the Office of the Bishop (synod office) has been leading for a few years now. Dwelling in the Word entails a person reading a passage of Scripture and while they are reading it, the listeners mark a printed copy by underlining, circling or somehow noting words, phrases or sections that somehow speak to them as they listen to see/realize/understand what God might be up to for us today in the chosen passage. They then share this with a person sitting nearby. We’ve been doing this for our devotion time in church council now for many months as well as in the Missional River Team meetings and it usually brings interesting discussions and lessons.

As we were Dwelling in the Word, I was struck by how this is also a good spiritual practice for us as individuals as we read Scripture. First of all, we are in God’s Word and reading it. Obviously, this is a GOOD THING! Secondly, it helps us to listen and search for the message in the text in a different way than we might otherwise. Listening may not necessarily feel like a spiritual practice, but when you think about it, it really is. We can very easily jump to a mindset of talking and sharing our opinions or thoughts, but we don’t often take extra time to listen. As the saying goes, “You have two ears and one mouth. You should listen twice as much as you speak.” Dwelling in the Word even when using well-known texts (and I would say ESPECIALLY with well-known texts) offers new insights and lessons many times. So I encourage you to Dwell in the Word on your own as a spiritual practice. Join with someone else and have them read a text while you listen and then you read while they listen. Then talk about what you each heard – sharing new insights or sections you didn’t pay much attention to before. Or find an audio copy of someone reading the Bible and listen to that during your devotion time and write down your insights and passages that speak to you of God’s work. Spend time listening to what God has to say to you in familiar Bible stories (– like the birth of Christ). And then take even more time to REFLECT on what you “heard”. In our culture today, we don’t allow much time for listening and reflection and yet those are two skills that bring about the most and the best kind of personal growth.

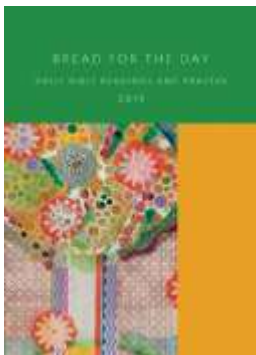

PAJAMAS FOR NEW LIFE CENTER FOR GIRLS

New Life Center provides help, healing and hope to emotionally disturbed girls, ages 11 to 17. It was founded in 1993 and is run by Upbring. CTK Women of the ELCA have for years coordinated buying a Christmas gift for each girl, and in 2009 settled on pajamas and slippers. In 2012, we also added a journal. While we have a small dedicated group of women who shop for bargains all year long, we still need your support because New Life has a capacity of 80 girls. We will receive name, age, sizes, and color preferences for each girl. If you would be willing to shop, please decide how many girls you will buy for, and tell Erika Robeson at the 8:00 a.m. worship service or Carol Bearce at the 10:30 a.m. worship service, or leave a note in our mailboxes. We expect to receive info in late November, and will then pass each girl's data along to you. We need to have the pajamas in hand by December 16 to allow time for wrapping and organizing by cottage. You may also just buy pajamas as you see a bargain, and we'll match them up with requests and preferences. Guidelines for pajamas: Pants may be long or capri, but no shorts. Tops may be long or short sleeve; but no sleeveless, no tank tops, no spaghetti straps. Also no metal such as zippers or grommets. As for decoration, no inappropriate sayings, no skull and crossbones, no hearts. If you would rather just contribute money, please your donation in your offering envelope and mark it for WELCA/New Life.
