At a recent conference pastors' gathering, one of those present shared about her visit to Ireland and the Corrymeela Community. Corrymeela is Northern Ireland's oldest peace and reconciliation organization with "fifty years of experience working alongside fractured communities and groups who are finding

their relationships difficult". She also shared some poetry from their current community leader, Pádraig Ó Tuama.



In our discussions on spiritual practices, it seemed fitting to me to include poetry and our reflection upon it as one of our monthly topics. Poetry can be used just like devotional books, emails or other resources as a way to help us reflect on our faith, our lives and our relationship with God. I was moved by both poems she shared that day and our resulting conversations and so I wanted to share one here for your spiritual practice.

### The Facts of Life from "Sorry for Your Troubles" by Pádraig Ó Tuama

That you were born  
and you will die.  
That you will sometimes love enough  
and sometimes not.  
That you will lie  
if only to yourself.  
That you will get tired.  
That you will learn most from the situations  
you did not choose.  
That there will be some things that move you  
more than you can say.  
That you will live  
that you must be loved.  
That you will avoid questions most urgently in  
need of your attention.  
That you began as the fusion of a sperm and an  
egg  
of two people who once were strangers  
and may well still be.  
That life isn't fair.  
That life is sometimes good  
and sometimes even better than good.

That life is often not so good.  
That life is real  
and if you can survive it, well,  
survive it well  
with love  
and art  
and meaning given  
where meaning's scarce.  
That you will learn to live with regret.  
That you will learn to live with respect.  
That the structures that constrict you  
may not be permanently constraining.  
That you will probably be okay.  
That you must accept change  
before you die  
but you will die anyway.  
So you might as well live  
and you might as well love.  
You might as well love.  
You might as well love.

Life is such a beautiful gift – that is sometimes glorious and sometimes hard to get through. No matter what, we have the gift of God's love and our relationships with each other throughout this life and beyond. I hope you spend some time reflecting on this poem and/or others, on scripture or on devotional writings. Spend time reflecting on the message found therein and the meaning for your life today and where God seems to be guiding you. Our spiritual practices are meant to cultivate our spiritual development. Please engage in some sort of spiritual practices daily!

## STEWARDSHIP OF SELF—THE PROMISE OF PEACE

Now that Christmas and Epiphany are behind us, our lead into the next celebration of our church is Easter. But that is still a long way off—but not too far. As individuals, how should we prepare ourselves for this next adventure? My stewardship interests in the near future will focus on us as individuals, beginning with striving for some inner peace as well as world peace. Jesus has given us many possibilities for writing something on stewardship. I am going to focus on some of God's Promises of things positive; one bible gives us sixteen possibilities and also provides a list of seventeen promises of our faults. These will be the subject of several stewardship messages. Then if that isn't enough to provide thought for us, we can and will dwell on some of the Miracles of Jesus, and possibly the several miracles of the Apostles. The great many Parables of Jesus are possible areas for stewardship thought as well.

But let me go back to the Positive Promises of God and share some thoughts on the Promise of Peace. We have all been saturated with so many news items that permeate our lives that we don't seem to be able to find peace anywhere. Where can we find Peace of Mind as well as Peace in our neighborhood, city, county, state, and country. Negativity abounds with the news. Many people, including clergy, have expressed a desire for world Peace. How can we achieve some Peace when we are surrounded by so many distractions? The Apostle John proclaims to us in Chapter 14: 27, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid." In this passage he is pointing the direction for us to not be consumed with all that doesn't seem peaceful to us. We should direct our attention to other matters instead. If we focus on the negative, we will indeed be bothered with other worldly matters that are beyond our personal level.

Then, in Romans 5: 1-2, we are told that . . . since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; ". . . When we are troubled and not at peace with ourselves or our surroundings, we only need to turn to God and our Lord and Savior, Jesus to find Peace." This is easy if we let our minds and thoughts go directly of Him; continuing to be troubled, upset, and angry is Satan's way of winning.

## OUTREACH COMMITTEE

Happy New Year from Outreach! We had a very busy 2018 and we could not have done it without the help of our congregation. Christ the King is the best when helping in the community. Below is a brief recap of how your donations helped families who were served by RACAP in 2018:

- a. Contributed \$3,545 to RACAP in monetary donations.
- b. Assisted with the 2018 Back to School Shoe Program: We helped RACAP provide shoes to 173 families, 389 children. Total cost \$5,785.84.
- c. 2018 Holiday Meals: We helped with the total cost of food - \$4,740.09
- d. 2018 Thanksgiving: RACAP served 218 families, 326 adults plus 209 children which equaled 535 total number served. RACAP provided for 55 families and sponsors provided for 160 families. Cost \$1,048.35. The Women of the ELCA sponsored a RACAP family with a Thanksgiving holiday basket.
- e. 2018 Christmas: RACAP served 292 families, 450 adults plus 343 children which equaled 792 total number served. RACAP provided meals for 211 families and sponsors provided meals for 81 families. A total of 281 children from 106 families were provided gifts by 42 sponsors. Cost \$3,691.71. Outreach sponsored a family of four—mom, dad, and two boys ages 5 and 3. Thank you to members for their donations toward food and gifts for the family. Women of the ELCA sponsored a RACAP family with a Christmas holiday basket.

Look for information in the coming months about Outreach plans for 2019. Again, thank you for helping make 2018 a successful year for RACAP.
