We begin the season of Lent with *Ashes to Go* Imposition of Ashes at 12:00 noon in the front parking lot at CTK and with Lenten Worship, which will include the imposition of ashes and Holy Communion, at 7:00 pm .

MID-WEEK LENTEN MEALS & WORSHIP BEGIN ON WEDNESDAY, MARCH 13

We will once again be offering mid-week worship services during Lent and a meal beforehand. Take some time to slow down and attend to your spiritual well-being in this season of reflection. We will have meals beginning at 5:30 p.m. offered by different church groups (as noted below).

- March 13 - Youth
- March 20 - Outreach
- March 27 - Women of the ELCA
- April 3 - Men's Group
- April 10 - Choir



After the meal, come to the sanctuary at 6:30 pm to worship using Holden Evening Prayer and experience prayer stations.



Each month, we have been sharing about a different spiritual practice. For Lent, we decided to continue this focus with some action on all of our parts. For our mid-week Lenten services, we will use Holden Evening Prayer for the liturgy and join it with LEAD's (Living Everyday As Disciples) material on Praying the Psalms. Each week, we will have a short meditation on a chosen psalm and then offer time for different prayer stations.

Martin Luther said, "Prayer is climbing up into the heart of God." and so we will spend some intentional time focusing on this wonderful spiritual practice to help us with that climb into God's heart. One of our prayer stations will be a Prayer Walk Labyrinth. Labyrinths have been used in Christianity since the fourth century; although how they were originally used is unclear. Modern use is through prayer and self-reflection. Another Lutheran church with a permanent outdoor prayer labyrinth has explained it in the following way. 5

"Our Christian life can be described as a journey with God, bringing us ever closer in our relationship with God and with others. A prayer walk labyrinth provides a metaphor model of our Christian life journey as we face many turns we did not expect in our search for a quiet center. Some gently curving sections of the prayer walk allow us to move easily and quickly; others slow us down and catch our attention as they turn us abruptly in the opposite direction. The path may begin by leading us deceptively toward the center, only to circle around it and then move away.



We may meet others on the way that we can follow or lead. We may need to step aside as someone with more confidence or experience moves quickly past us or we may simply be on a more contemplative walk, confident of where we are going but walking slowly to maximize the experience. On reaching the center of the prayer labyrinth, we can rest, pray, or experience a new meaning to "being centered". Does this sound interesting, yet familiar to you? We encourage you to experience it.

There is no right or wrong way to walk this prayer labyrinth. The only rules are to respect the prayer walk and others who are there. Simply begin, focusing on a quiet mind and open heart that allows God to accompany you."¹ We will have further instructions available at the labyrinth each week.

We hope (and pray ;D) that all the prayer stations will help your faith journey in some meaningful way.

STEWARDSHIP OF SELF---FAULTS

God's Promise

Not long ago I wrote to you about generosity and how certain events suddenly put me in the center of someone else's generosity to me. Well it happened again, only this time it was local in a grocery store where I had stopped to pick up some quick items—only three items. I went to the 15 items or less to speed through a check out; a couple walked in just ahead of me with two items—two loafs of bread. (Perhaps I was supposed to furnish the fish.) The cashier rang up his two items and then he instructed the cashier to put my items on his bill. I heard him and protested only to have him say “it is okay.” His wife repeated what he stated. I thanked him a couple of times and away we went. I didn't know this couple, they didn't know me but that is the way generosity in God's world presents itself, when one least expects it from people no different from ourselves. What a great day that was in my life made possible by unexpected generosity.

The remainder of this piece is about FAULTS. You know the kind that you have heard too often. Bickering! It is not my fault! It is his/her fault! Or, the stern voice asking “who did this”? The stern voice evokes the message of fault for one of you, doesn't it! Well, the point of all this is we don't need to fault someone or something in our lives. That is too much negativity; why not turn something that has the beginning of being negative into something positive. Provide a positive example to cover the important or unimportant discrepancy. People will pick up on that quicker and appreciate the candid positive note. Avoid negative treatment. Life is much better without it. Change the word CAN'T to a positive word like CAN. Then provide positive feedback to the individual, child or adult, using a verbal reward.

Changing a negative into a positive will speak well of everyone involved. And God speaks to us in Psalm 103: 12 with these words: “as far as the east is from the west, so far he removes our transgressions from us.” Isn't it great that he doesn't spend time picking and choosing a piece here and there and telling us it is OKAY! He doesn't have time for faults as mentioned above. He wants us to put our minds in a positive frame of mind. Just do it! Isaiah 43:25 echo's this same theme for us “I, I am He who blots out your transgressions for my own sake, and I will not remember your sins.” Shouldn't we, too, forget our negativity when our minds want to revert to our silly notion of “I am right, you are in the wrong.” Finally, in Hebrews 10: 24, we are implored to “consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, . . . but encouraging one another, . . .” Wow, I say! In order to meet these requirements laid out for us, we have our work cut out for us. Nothing is impossible with the help of God. Aren't we fortunate! Not too long ago I heard a man state that he didn't have any faults, just many inefficiencies, not deficiencies, which need adjusting. Where do we stand with our faults, inefficiencies, or deficiencies? God loves all sinners.
