The Present God -

For the last six months upon our arrival in Texas, we've been handling major transitions. From setting to new home, far away from family, new vocational experience, language challenges, etc. Like any of us when we go through transitions and adjustments in life, tiredness and fatigue are increased. However, I have experienced that connecting with the truth of God's presence through our daily walk including our transitions makes a big difference. It is certainly something that we all already know, but we often get in the way of religious expressions and words and forget about the scriptural truth. So being able to have or create a consciousness of Presence, to consider that God, is always present, can make a difference. Our God is certainly present but being conscious makes a difference in our pilgrimage. Through all scripture God has taken care of letting us know that he is present here and now. We can define how:

Presence: Being in front of a person or in the same place as her. Find yourself present.

Present: It is in the same place; it is in front of a person or in the presence of the person. It also means Now, when it's being said. Current time. At this moment you pause and ponder what would you do if God were here and now (Present)? What impact does it have on your life to consciously affirm that God is present now?

The Psalmist affirms to us the presence of God in Psalm 139:7-12:

Where can I go from your spirit?

Or where can I flee from your presence?

⁸ If I ascend to heaven, you are there;

if I make my bed in Sheol, you are there.

⁹ If I take the wings of the morning

and settle at the farthest limits of the sea,

¹⁰ even there your hand shall lead me,

and your right hand shall hold me fast.

¹¹ If I say, "Surely the darkness shall cover me,

and the light around me become night,"

¹² even the darkness is not dark to you;

the night is as bright as the day,

for darkness is as light to you

Jesus promises to be ever present in St. Matthew 28:20:

... And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.

We as Christians believe that the incarnate God became present in the human, making the everyday and the world the place of his revelation. Even though God transcends everything and everyone. We cannot separate God from the human being, from history, from the world. Being aware of the Presence empowers us to take on and face the real, life itself in all its complexity. In God's Presence we live, move, and exist. The Spirit works and reflects God's presence of love for all. May we, as a daily devotional exercise affirm the Presence of God and make that affirmation an experience that nourishes our sense of our own life and the foundation of our hope.

El Dios Presente -cotidianidad

Durante los últimos seis meses a nuestra llegada a Texas hemos estado manejando importantes transiciones. Desde ajuste a nueva casa, la familia distante, experiencia vocacional nueva, manejo del idioma, etc. Como cualquiera de nosotros cuando atravesamos transiciones y ajustes en la vida se aumenta el cansancio y la fatiga. Sin embargo, conectar con la verdad de la presencia de Dios a través de nuestro caminar cotidiano incluyendo nuestras transiciones hace una gran diferencia. Ciertamente, es algo que ya todos sabemos, pero muchas veces nos involucramos en las expresiones y palabras religiosas y nos olvidamos de la verdad escritural. Así que el poder tener o crear una conciencia de Presencia, tener en cuenta que Dios, siempre está presente puede hacer la diferencia. Nuestro Dios esta presente ciertamente pero el estar consciente hace la diferencia en nuestro peregrinar. A través de toda la escritura Dios se ha encargado de hacernos saber que él está presente Aquí y Ahora. Podemos definir como:

Presencia: Estar delante de una persona o en el mismo lugar que ella. Hallarse presente.

Presente: Esta en el mismo sitio, esta delante de una persona o en presencia de la persona. También significa Ahora, cuando se está diciendo. Tiempo actual. En este momento Has una pausa y reflexiona ¿Qué harías si realmente Dios estuviera Aquí y Ahora (Presente)? ¿Qué impacto tiene en tu vida el afirmar conscientemente que Dios está presente Ahora?

El salmista nos afirma la presencia de Dios en Salmo 139:7-12:

¿A dónde me iré de tu Espíritu? ¿Y a dónde huiré de tu presencia? Si subiere a los cielos, allí estás tú; Y si en el Seol hiciere mi estrado, he aquí, allí tú estás. Si tomare las alas del alba Y habitare en el extremo del mar, Aun allí me guiará tu mano, Y me asirá tu diestra. Si dijere: Ciertamente las tinieblas me encubrirán; Aun la noche resplandecerá alrededor de mí. Aun las tinieblas no encubren de ti, Y la noche resplandece como el día; Lo mismo te son las tinieblas que la luz.

Jesús promete estar siempre presente en San Mateo 28:20:

...y he aquí yo estoy con vosotros todos los días, hasta el fin del mundo. Amén.

Los cristianos creemos que el Dios encarnado se hizo presente en lo humano, haciendo de lo cotidiano y del mundo el lugar de su revelación. No se puede separar a Dios del ser humano, de la historia, del mundo. El estar consciente de la Presencia nos empodera para asumir y afrontar lo real, la vida misma en toda su complejidad. En esa Presencia vivimos, nos movemos y existimos. Su Espíritu trabaja y plasma con su presencia de amor a todos. Que podamos como ejercicio devocional diario, afirmar la Presencia y hacer de esa experiencia misteriosa y comprometedora el sentido de la propia vida y el fundamento de nuestra esperanza.
