I have previously written about worship as one of our spiritual practices, but it is one of the central things we do as Christians and I want to share some more about it following some discussion by the Worship Committee. After our Worship Committee meeting, I stumbled across a variety of different sources that all had some connection to what we had been discussing. (I see this as the mysterious and guiding work of the Holy Spirit. :P)

One of these sources was a comment someone posted on a Facebook page for ELCA clergy. This individual stated, “We’ve made false dichotomies by designing church for adults with a few things for the kiddos in order to assuage our guilt: children’s sermons, children’s church, acolytes, kid’s choir and activity bags. We tell ourselves, we care about children in worship. Baptism declares us equal before God, but we have created worship as an adult experience; because God forbid ‘dumbing down’ for the kids means the adults won’t get fed. We need to re-imagine worship from the perspective that we are all in this together – every generation with an equal footing and something to teach and something to learn.”



Previously, I had seen this meme (see the graphic) also on Facebook, which was likewise addressing the varied (and yet quite similar) needs of multiple generations in worship. And before this, a church member sent me an article on “Vibrant Worship for All Ages”. This article mentioned that “‘Intergenerational worship’ is worship that seeks to equally value people of all ages. These are services that intentionally consider the needs of diverse ages in worship and the accessibility of full participation of different generations.”<sup>1</sup> It further noted that there were six traits of congregations practicing worship for all ages. These traits are: 1. Intentionality (in planning worship for all ages), 2. Full Participation (of all ages), 3. the Sound Factor (beyond normal “church” sounds, these are the sounds of the people gathered – sounds like sneezes and

coughs, a dropped hymnal, the whoosh of an oxygen tank), 4. Commitment of Time (preparing for worship), 5. Reflection & Responsiveness (specifically about experiences IN worship), and 6. Flexibility (in dealing with unplanned occurrences during worship). The author stated that these things matter because “when we gather together as younger and older images of the Creator, there is a wholeness that would not otherwise be. ... Furthermore, we have gifts to share with each other. Each generation of our lives offers us fresh insight, unique ways of connecting with God, and new abilities that we can share with the community. Every generation has something to offer. Substantial effort should be made to include everyone in the full worship service – both those who cannot yet bring themselves to church and those who can no longer do so.”<sup>1</sup>

I share all this because the Worship Committee is planning on making further changes in the nave (seating area) to **enhance our worship** and to make it better suited for worship for all ages. An added benefit of these changes is greater flexibility for more music groups and different worship styles/experiences. Stay tuned!
