LENT BEGINS ASH WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 26

12:00 Noon *Ashes to Go*

7:00 P. M. Holy Communion & Imposition of Ashes

We begin the season of Lent with *Ashes to Go* Imposition of Ashes at 12:00 noon in the front parking lot at CTK. Please let anyone else know who may be interested. We will start our mid-week Lenten services with an evening worship service at 7:00 p.m., which includes the imposition of ashes and Holy Communion.



Most of y'all know that I am a bit of a prankster. I love a good practical joke! That being said I want to clarify something that some have thought is me being a joker. In Holy Communion, I tend to give a good sized piece of bread. This is intentional and not a joke. I try to give a piece of bread about the size of my thumbnail. Sometimes (unfortunately for many of you), the bread tears off in a bigger chunk. Even so, this isn't a bad thing.

In the miracle stories of Jesus, we have two occurrences of the miraculous catch/draught of fish – one in Luke and one in John. In Luke, after a night of unsuccessful fishing, Jesus tells Peter to throw out the nets and “they caught such a large number of fish that their nets began to break.” Among many interpretations, this large haul of fish was symbolic of the abundance given to us by God.

The reason I give such a good sized piece of bread is as a physical reminder of the **ABUNDANCE** of God's grace and love. Holy Communion is meant to be a place where we are reminded of so many things. It reminds us of our union together with ALL the saints as the Body of Christ (including those who have gone before us, those gathered with us at CTK, others worshipping God around the world and all those who come after us). It is a remembrance of Christ's sacrifice, a celebration of the family of God and so much more. And it is a regular, physical reminder of God's grace and love, which has been given to us freely and abundantly. I give a larger piece of bread to symbolize the ABUNDANCE that we receive in this blessed meal and throughout our lives. So please don't think that I'm trying to play a joke on you or make you choke down a big chunk of bread with a very small serving of wine. It is a visual and physical reminder of how much **YOU ARE LOVED!**

STEWARDSHIP OF SELF: TAKE MY WILL

Stewardship of self speaks to us as individuals and what we may be able to do for others, individually or collectively. Can you think of a time when you helped someone other than a family member? Can you think of a time when we, as a church, helped someone other than a family member? I'm certain that you can answer yes to both questions. We are a caring, loving church and I am thankful that we are because people are in need of our love and care every day. Not just yesterday, or tomorrow, but right now and each and every day. A message from Paul, the apostle, to Timothy, a young apostle, who needed guidance stated "Set the believers an example in speech and conduct, in love, in faith, in purity." (See 1 Timothy 4:12) You have done exactly this in a big way. Let me tell you the story.

This past May, 2019, while in Cottage Grove, MN, visiting our daughter and family, I stopped for a quick lunch at Wendy's. While in line another man came in and we started chatting. My order came and went to a seat, then his came and he came by asking if he could join me. Well, certainly was my answer. We chatted and quickly learned that he was a Stage 4 cancer person and hurting badly, mentally as well as physically. I informed him that I, too, am a cancer person having survived Stage 3 for 6.5 years. We both needed to leave when he asked me to text him periodically. This I did, not a big chore to do, a simple request. We continued to share news about our well-being with each other the remainder of the summer and fall.

You folks, too, have been helping him although you may not know it. His name is Ray Schmidt and is on the CTK prayer list. Your prayers have sustained him through his pain and suffering from chemo. We met again at Christmas time in Minnesota and chatted again. It was great to see a new friend, but this time the chatter was all good news. He had recently completed a full body scan looking for the usually ever present cancer spots on his bones and on other body parts. He was more upbeat this time than he had been all summer. The technician doing the scan was smiling as she did her work and when asked about the smiles, she told him there wasn't one cancer spot in his body. WOW! What great news that was; he will continue to receive his infusions for a while yet. His message to me was to tell the people at CTK that their prayers helped him a great deal. The prayers gave him comfort knowing that others (neighbors near and far) were working on his behalf. This is exactly what Paul was conveying to Timothy, help others in need. We don't always need to shell out cash to be helpful, a silent word of prayer, a thoughtful and kind word works wonders also. Our church wasn't the only church praying for his recovery, other local churches were involved. Can there be too much prayer? Not really! It is God's will that we pray for each other, especially when there is a need. Let us continue to use the power of prayer to sustain others.

LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF (LWR)

LWR activities have been an ongoing effort at Christ the King since 1995, with the Women of the ELCA serving as the focal point. During February, and part of March, our emphases will be on collecting soap, collecting items for personal care kits, and finishing the work we've begun on baby care kits and quilts. Here's what you can do to help:

DONATE SOAP. We need only bath soap (4-5 oz. bars) for the personal care kits and the baby care kits. LWR no longer collects bulk soap, so personal size bars and hotel soap are no longer accepted. (Any donations that don't meet the new criteria will be given to RACAP.)

DONATE PERSONAL CARE KIT items. They will be combined with the donations of others to make complete kits.

Soap (bath size bar - 4—5 oz.)

Combs (large tooth only)

Toothbrushes (adult size)

Metal nail clippers
