Drive-In Worship

Sunday, June 14, 21, & 28

9 & 10:30 am

NOTE the change in time for the first service.



This requires a lot of logistics and cooperation. The change in worship time for the first service is to allow for set up. Please read and **FOLLOW** these instructions so that we can safely gather together for worship in our parking lot.

These worship services are possible because we have purchased a SHORT range FM radio transmitter (limited to 1,000 feet) to work with our sound system. When you arrive at church, a sign will tell you which station to which you should tune. We will also post the station on our Facebook page.

FIRST and FOREMOST, **everyone MUST remain in their cars at all times.** You WILL NOT be able to use the restroom as we are unable to sanitize it after every use (which is the current recommendation). Worship will be abbreviated. We are aiming for each service to last around thirty minutes. No person to person fellowship can take place. Otherwise, we won't be able to continue Drive-In Worship. I'm sure y'all agree we **DON'T** want to make the news (local or national) that we re-gathered and then had an influx of cases.

We suggest you keep your car running so the radio will not drain your battery and to keep the air conditioning on since we strongly discourage having windows down. Because of these first two points (no bathroom use and leaving your car running), we recommend that you **do not arrive** at church more than FIFTEEN minutes early (unless you are helping).

Your worship bulletin for ALL THREE WEEKS is included in this newsletter. Please bring it with you or download a digital version. You will also need to bring your own Bible, as well as something for communion; your preferred type of bread and either wine or grape juice and cups.

DRIVE-IN WORSHIP - continued

For the sake of efficiency, parking attendants will tell you where to park (just like if you were at the Alamodome or rodeo). **If you are willing to help with this, please call the church office.** The entrances on Pat Booker Rd and the first (northernmost) entrance on Northview Dr. will be closed. You will need to enter through the second (southern) entrance on Northview Dr. We will open the barricade by the dumpster and we are asking everyone to drive around the buildings and exit onto Parkview Dr. There is a map on the front cover of the bulletin (found at the back of this newsletter). When parking, park your vehicle so that you face the church building. So obviously many of you will need to back into the parking space.

As much as we would LOVE for everyone to be able to gather for these worship services, we unfortunately still request any immunocompromised individuals to stay home. We will still be recording the sermon (and possibly the whole service) to post online later each Sunday.

In the case of inclement weather, watch for updates on Facebook, the church website, and through Flocknotes (join if you haven't already, it's easy - see page 3).

We are trying these ideas out for the sake of everyone. Please realize we may change these logistics from week to week. So please offer us some grace and if you have suggestions for a better way to do something, please let us know (just not in the moment, which may create a traffic jam).



LIFE AS WE KNEW IT IS GONE (again)

When we began this journey in mid March, I had envisioned that we would make it through those weeks quickly and then go back to the way things were before, as I imagine many of you had thought as well. Yet, as we have learned more about COVID-19, we have realized that we will not be able to go back to "normal" (as I shared last month). Sadly, life as we knew it is gone and we will NOT return there. But this is not new - for us or for humanity. Life changed for all of us on 9/11 and life as we knew it then was gone. And "life as we knew it" has changed many times in history before that. People have dealt with changes in life throughout our human experience. It is one of our strengths. We adapt and grow.

Even so, it still brings grief and there will undoubtedly be many transitions for everyone. We are ALL going to need time to heal. There is a lot that we are each contending with right now - anxiety, grief, worry, fear, pain, isolation, economic uncertainty to name a few. This is a lot to bear and we each bear it differently. Likewise, healing will look different for each of us, but we have each other. Remember to offer some extra grace to people now and in the future since even more than ever, we won't know what they are going through.

In some respects, the loss of our "normal" way of being is a good thing. Some necessary changes can be made to rectify exclusions and bad habits we've fostered (like the ones mentioned last month). As we move forward, we can prayerfully discern our new "normal" with intentionality and inclusivity, forethought and Christian love. We can get inventive and innovative about the path forward. Even in the midst of this pandemic and the tragedy therein, God is with us and God is doing a new thing; just as we read in Isaiah 43:18-19. "Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert."

We are moving ahead slowly with the advisement of our local, state and national leaders, along with Bishop Briner and the whole synod. While **we are NOT YET to the point of returning to worship in our buildings**, we are trying something new and different for us in the Drive-In Worship. As a point of information, we emailed a video (which can be found on the church Facebook page) that shows many of the details and logistics involved in order to worship inside. Go take a look if you haven't already watched it. It is NOT an easy thing to be inside the building. Many factors have to be considered and acted upon. Because of all this, it seems that we are still a long way off from

gatherings in the building. Even as difficult as that is to hear / realize / admit, we know it is the best decision for the sake of our community.

In one of the sessions I watched today in an online continuing education event, the speaker shared how the Kingdom of God comes near to us in our beloved community. The fullness of our human experience happens in community with each other. That makes this situation all the more difficult, since we are not gathering in community for the sake of our community. But our community is also what makes this bearable. We still have our relationships with each other. We can still connect via the phone, mailings, and in video calls and conferences.

My friend, Peggy Hahn (Executive Director of LEAD), posted the following online recently and I think they are helpful words for all of us to hear. "We are going through this together. God is going through this with us. We are the Israelites in the wilderness. We are Mary, afraid and hopeful with pregnancy. We are Peter, lying and denying Jesus. We are on the road to Emmaus. And we are Thomas, who doubts. We are in pretty good company as we heal. Lean into your prayers and your study of scripture. And listen. Just listen."

This is great advice for all of us - now and always. Get strength and comfort in your prayers and your study of scripture and then listen. Listen to your heart, mind and body. Listen to your family, friends and loved ones. And listen to God.
