NOTE the change in having only one service!



The Worship & Music Committee has discussed again and decided to continue our Drive-In worship services since Coronavirus cases have not decreased in our area. **HOWEVER, we will only have one service** through August because of the heat, but with some other exciting options (see the next paragraphs). We ask for your continued patience and understanding as we continue to care for the most vulnerable among us, which is what Jesus calls us to do. As we will have more cars in the parking lot, please be aware that the FM signal can be heard in the UC Library parking lot too. So you can park over there as well.

We will SING a couple verses of some hymns (as long as you remain in your car with the windows closed.) We have chosen hymns from the old green hymnal (Lutheran Book of Worship) and we invite everyone to keep a copy of the hymnal in your car. If you don't have a copy of the hymnal, we have some available at church, which you can pick up during office hours or at worship.

We are also LIVESTREAMING the entire worship service, (which will also be recorded). So if you are unable to attend, you will be able to watch / participate in actual time or watch the recorded service later. These can be found on our YouTube channel (also with a link on the church's Facebook page).

The bulletin for worship is at the back of this newsletter in the same format as has been used previously (again with content pertinent to the week). You can either bring this printed copy* with you on Sunday mornings or download/view a digital version on your phone or tablet found on the church website.

We will continue to barricade the entrances on Pat Booker Rd and the first one on Northview. So please proceed down Northview to the second entrance to be guided to a parking spot. Additionally, you are still asked to bring your own communion elements to limit exposure. However, we do have some pre-packaged communion sets available, which you can pick up when you arrive on Sundays or in the church office Monday through Friday, 8-12am.

In the case of inclement weather, watch for updates on Facebook, the church website, and through Flocknotes (join if you haven't already. It's easy! See page 11).

STEWARDSHIP OF SELF: GOOD TIMES by Don Nellermoe

Can you remember the good times you had when you could go for a friendly walk, go out for dinner, go to a movie, attend a ball game, have a friendly beverage with adult friends? Times have changed a lot so it may be hard to recall all of the details about those good times.

With all the HARD TIMES that have happened withing the past 6 or 7 months, we definitely need to be praying that the GOOD TIMES will come again in the near future. President Franklin D. Roosevelt reminded us during the outset of World War II that “We have nothing to fear but fear itself.” Our present Pandemic is unlike tough times that we may have had in the recent past. We need to pray that God will watch over us and help us do the right things to help us get through this current nasty experience. 
