





## EPIPHANY - JANUARY 10<sup>TH</sup>

While Epiphany is technically (always) on January 6th, we will be celebrating Epiphany in worship on Sunday, January 10th as we conclude the Christmas season with a celebration of God's glory revealed in Jesus Christ. Like the light of the star that guided the magi, we are sent out to be beacons of the light of Christ, sharing the good news of God's love for all people. Come join us in worship, where we will once again be handing out Star Gifts. These are the words on a star shaped paper which you are invited to reflect about all year.

If possible, drop them off during the week beforehand, but definitely bring them to worship early.

## OFFICIAL NOTICE OF CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

**On Sunday, January 24, 2021 at 9:45am**, the Congregational Meeting of Christ the King Lutheran Church will be held for the purpose of electing council members for 2021, voting on the funding of the Fire Alarm bid of \$35,405 (see article on pg 5) and reviewing the final 2020 financials.

Because of the uncertainty of our pandemic gathering restrictions, we are planning for this meeting to be held in the parking lot like the budget meeting in October. We will once again offer **two ways to participate in the meeting**. The **first** way to "attend" is in person in the parking lot, remaining in your vehicles. Questions and comments will occur through telephones. The **second** way to "attend" is from the comfort of your home via the internet. We will end the live-stream feed for worship and start a Zoom meeting. When we are closer to the meeting date, we will email the Zoom link. We will give instructions that day for those on Zoom on how to vote, ask questions and give comments.

We realize this isn't ideal and we apologize for anyone who is unable to attend via one of these two methods. However, due to pandemic precautions, this is our attempt at reaching the most people in the safest way.

Annual reports will be available Sunday, January 17th at worship  
and during the following week in the church office.


Back in April 2020, part of my newsletter article said the following:

“Dinah Ryson posted a meme on her Facebook page that offered these questions to ask yourself daily during the quarantine.

1. Who am I checking on or connecting with today?
2. What expectations of “normal” am I letting go of today?
3. How am I getting outside today?
4. How am I moving my body today?
5. How am I expressing my creativity today?
6. What type of self-care am I practicing today?
7. What am I grateful for today?

Even in our isolation, we can find things for which to be grateful. In fact this is an important practice especially when things seem so discouraging. One of the books I am reading is called “Love Warrior” by Glennon Doyle. Therein, she tells the story of a personal crisis through which she is going. She realizes something significant about her crisis that related to the word disaster. She remembered that it comes from the word “astro” meaning stars and “dis” meaning without, so “without stars”. She goes on to say that in this crisis in which she was in, that “it would only be a disaster if she lost all awareness of the light”. This speaks to us beautifully as we find ourselves separated from one another. We, who are Christians, proclaim Jesus as the Light of the World. This situation in which we find ourselves is not a disaster. It is only a disaster if we cannot find the light. But if we keep our focus on Christ as the Light of the World, then we can get through this.”

I shared this again with you because as we enter the season of Epiphany, we are called to share the light of Christ and to spread the love of God to everyone. Even though we are ten months into this pandemic experience, this is not a disaster when we remember to keep some awareness of the light; (I say this realizing that darkness is NOT bad. After all, we can't see the beauty of stars without the darkness.) but more than that to keep some awareness of God and Christ, especially Christ within others. When I go through trying times, the words of Isaiah 43 bring me great comfort.



I also chose to share this section again because the 7 questions to ask yourself are still helpful and they are good advice for us; especially since we are ten months in and still with an unknown as to the length of this pandemic. Be sure to offer extra grace, both to yourself and to others, but also take care of yourself and others.

The season of Epiphany is about the love of God made manifest (revealed) in the person of Jesus Christ. This is exactly what is happening when we stay connected with one another (in safe ways) and take care of each other during the extraordinary times of this pandemic. Herein, God is revealed!!

## FIRE ALARM PROPOSAL

The Universal City Fire Marshall did a comprehensive check of our campus and we were out of compliance in a number of areas. The church council has been addressing the issues as we could (like all the new signage on the buildings), but the largest issue (and biggest concern) is that the sanctuary/office and Fellowship Hall buildings do not have an active fire monitoring system in either building and the sanctuary building does not have smoke/heat detectors, alert horns/strobes, and pull stations. This is a city requirement and not something for which we have an option of doing or not doing. We will be discussing the funding of this project at the congregational meeting on January 24th. So please come to have questions answered, hear discussion and help make a decision about our physical spaces and how we can continue to offer ministry and outreach for our community.

## STEWARDSHIP OF SELF: WARMTH

Snow was flying through the air making it difficult to see across the farm yard. And it was cold, very cold at a minus 20 degrees below zero. Cold weather and snow are not something that a farmer can put aside and not worry about the safety of family and animals. One such very cold day in January serves as a reminder of how harsh cold can be if we linger in it too long. We had to leave our car on the county road overnight; we thought it would be ready to go the next morning. My dad and I walked to the car to start it and take me to school. The car wouldn't start—too cold. Nothing to warm it. He called a close neighbor who brought a team of horses to pull the car. Often this works. An attempt was made to pull the car. It turned out to be a short pull; the wheels would not turn, they slid on the road. The horses and neighbor went home to get warm and so did we. The safety and warmth of our house was what we needed. My fingers and toes were close to the frost bite stage.

Providing warmth is part of the key for this seasonal event. Warmth can be provided in a number of ways on a farm. Some farmers actually had a kerosene space heater placed in their barn or chicken coop. Extreme caution was needed when this was done to avoid fire. Other farmers made certain that the animals had hay or a straw bedding to help keep them warm while we had a warm comfortable home to relax in. We said a prayer of Thanks for the neighbor who braved the cold to help someone in need. We also prayed for our good sense to leave well enough alone and stay inside to keep warm.

San Antonio, Texas, and North Dakota, my home state, have the same two cold months, January and February. Every winter was like that. Temperatures as low as minus 40 degrees were not uncommon in North Dakota. These blizzards and low temperatures usually occurred in January and February often extending into March and April. Cold weather like this makes for a long winter while we seek comfort and warmth. We often experience cold in our Christian Faith. This too needs warming. Someone once said that church is God's spiritual stove to warm us. During cold spells, the warmth of church often disappears, prayers often are not said, our bibles stay closed all because we focus on the cold and forget about these important warming features.



Hot chocolate and warm clothes help us with the physical warmth but it takes talking to a person and reading the word of God for some spiritual warmth. Lending a helping hand to a person in need of help adds warmth to two people, as does reading to a person with poor eyesight. Let us all try to remember to warm ourselves and others with our spiritual guidance. Try not to get frostbite during your cold spells, seek warmth from God.

“What do you take for granted and never question, e.g., the Pledge of Allegiance? If you really think about the words, you might better understand why some people of color object to saying it. Take a moment to look at the following website and learn about its history: <https://www.smithsonianmag.com/history/pledge-allegiance-pr-gimmick-patriotic-vow-180956332/>. Being uninformed or unaware contributes to the oppression of others. When people of color were asked what they feared most when talking about racism, their number one concern was retaliation. This racial confrontation formula looks something like this: a white person does something racially insensitive, hurtful, and harmful; a person of color points it out to them; the white person “goes nuclear”: Did you just call me a racist! I am not a racist! I’m a good person!

We have a lot of work to do to learn the “rest of the story” and to accept that we will never be able to fully empathize with the pain people of color feel. Join the discussion and learn with us.
