MID-WEEK LENTEN MEALS – 5:30PM

Lent has always been a time when we offer a meal before worship on Wednesdays. MID-WEEK LENTEN WORSHIP – 6PM OR THEREAFTER

The Shema, a passage from Deuteronomy 6, is recited daily by many of the Jewish faith and it forms the framework for Mark 12. The words of the Shema form a covenant between God and God's people and show us a way to respond to this God who so extravagantly loves us through the cross.

For our Lenten focus and theme during mid-week worship, we will be looking at the Shema from Deuteronomy, the passage from Mark 12:30 and connecting these with many Old Testament scriptures that tell of our covenants with God and others. The logistics for Drive-In worship will be too difficult and so we will be offering a recorded worship experience. We will have the different parts of the service led by many of YOU. This will give everyone a chance to see more members of our community, other than Pastor Mike, Vicar Ricardo and Mariesa (from their videos and leading worship). Our hope is that this will be another way

to keep connected with others from our church family in this extended time when we are apart. Since the worship serviced is pre-recorded, you can watch it at any point in the evening. We will "publish" it at some point every Wednesday afternoon. (Check Facebook, the church website and YouTube channel for specifics.)

PRAYER PRACTICE FOR LENT - PRAYING WITH BEADS



As I'm writing this, we have just come out of the big chill, snowpocalypse 2021, the winter storm of a generation, etc. No matter what we call it, we know it was awful and repercussions will be felt for some time to come. Beyond all the negatives, we also know that in this disaster (like in most), the true colors of people shine. People were checking on neighbors, housing others who had lost power, water and heat, offering their own resources and volunteering to help out in any way possible. These are but a few small examples of how Christ was shown in our actions.

In our February council meeting, we discussed how impossible it is for one person or even the twelve on council to check on everyone in the church in the midst of something dire – like the winter storm. So we are putting something in the works, but it made me think of something I heard of a few years ago now. (My apologies as I forget the source.)

In India, there is only one nurse for every 50 patients. Can you imagine?!?!? But the way they deal with this ratio shortfall is through friends and family. There are three or four friends and family members who are “watchers”. They watch for any change in condition or danger in their loved one who is the patient. And if they see something concerning, they get the nurse.

In John 13, Jesus says, “I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. ³⁵By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.” Christ the King has over 420 baptized members. There is no possible way I could effectively check on every one of you in a timely manner (especially in a disaster).

However, if we all chip in and do a small part, then the task is not overwhelming for any one of us. Christ calls us to care for one another and this is but one small way we do that very task. When we each keep a watch on one another, everyone feels connected and cared for. Connection and care are two major indicators of healthy and thriving groups, but more importantly than that, connection and care help us to know we are loved. When someone makes an effort to reach out and make contact, we know that person cares for us in some way. So I encourage you to take a moment and reach out to someone (by phone call, letter, text message, email or however) who you haven't spoken with in some time. In this way, we are helping people feel loved through our concern.

WALKING THE WALK AND EMBRACING NEW WAYS OF WORSHIP

“Welcoming all”


To walk the walk of “welcoming all”, we need to find creative ways of including and engaging children in worship and to encourage parents to bring their young children into the worship service. However, if they are relegated to the back of the church what can the children see – nothing but “big people’s” backs. No way can they see what is happening up front. And what do the parents end up doing? Entertaining them to prevent boredom. What if they had a place near the front where they could see, participate, and observe worship. What if they had a pray-ground!

What is a pray-ground? It is an inviting space in front of the nave that's especially designed for children and their families to experience worship through age-appropriate worship materials and to help keep them engaged in worship. In mid-2019 the Worship Committee proposed a pray-ground to the Council who in turn approved it in August 2019.

Individuals involved in children’s ministry have learned that “when children who are separated out of the worshipping community get to an age to decide for themselves if they want to be a part of worship, they will likely decide not to be part of worship because it hasn’t been part of their life.” Likewise, according to the “brain development of a young child they need opportunities to be part of something, so they see it as an important part of who they are.”

To accommodate the pray-ground the first two short pews on the “organ/piano” side of the nave will be removed and replaced with chairs. Doing so creates a more flexible worship area in the front that will also better accommodate individuals in wheelchairs or those using walkers. The picture below will give you an idea of CTK’s pray-ground.

STEWARDSHIP MESSAGE - MARCH 2021

We believe that Christian stewardship is the means by which we make the church and the kingdom a joy, and we agree that we all have the obligation to share our gifts of time, talents, and treasures. But have you ever experienced a time when you were sharing that joy with others and found that you were the recipient of the stewardship of others? I have, and I would like to share the following event which took place in late April, 1989 at the Maranatha Lutheran Mission in Las Milpas, Texas, a very small Hispanic community located in deep south Texas about 13 miles north of Reynosa, Mexico. Even though it was late April, it was very warm, or to put it another way, it was downright hot.

At the time I was the treasurer of the Southwestern Texas Synod of the ELCA. The 1989 Synod Assembly was held in McAllen, Texas, and the presiding bishop of the ELCA, The Rev. Dr. Herbert W. Chilstrom was an invited guest. The synod was, and continues to be, heavily involved in Hispanic ministry. As part of the assembly itinerary, attendees were given the opportunity to visit and participate in the evening worship service at the mission church in Las Milpas. When we arrived, we were immediately startled by the poverty and other challenges in which these faithful and proud Christians lived and worshiped. Their church was a wooden, unairconditioned building. Members and guests sat on benches or folding chairs. There were windows on each side of the building which was the primary source of ventilation. What made this service extra special was that Bishop Chilstrom presided over the service, which was in Spanish. We all joyfully struggled with the hymns and the message. The church was packed, and those who were not able to find a seat stood against the wall, while others stood outside and leaned through the open windows. Some even sat on the floor. The most memorable part of the service was that the Bishop presided over the baptism of a baby, confirmed several teenagers, and officiated at a wedding. It was quite an evening. I am thankful to have attended this event and witness firsthand the Spirit at work in this impoverished area of south Texas. These brothers and sisters in Christ joyfully shared their time, talent, and their limited treasures. I was the recipient of their stewardship and thank God for the blessing I received.



Creatively and Meaningfully Sharing the Lent thru Easter Season at Home with your Family

No, we don't decorate for Lent, Holy Week and Easter as we do for Christmas. But if one of the most basic reasons to decorate for Christmas is to remember the celebration of Jesus birth, then shouldn't now be a time to get our homes ready to remember that time meaningfully and prayerfully for Lent and Easter, to prayerfully worship as a family together.

Many of you picked up the Lent Family Boxes which pictured above left offers families the opportunity to begin building their own family Altar space and discussing Lent. This is a time to gather around and share in prayer devotions. Perhaps you did not get a chance to get a family box and would like one? I have extras. (not everything in the photo is in the box)

Last year, we also offered the opportunity to make crosses in front yards and post photos during Holy Week. The other 2 photos above are from last year. We are encouraging this again as many have asked us to post ideas to continue this tradition.

Here are ideas of liturgical pieces for Lent through Holy Week and Easter as well as things to gather for home altar: To your cross, add purple throughout Lent. On Palm Sunday, the color would change to red and add palm branches or leafy plants around your cross to remember Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem.

On the night before Maundy Thursday, place water pitchers towels and a big heart near and on your cross. This is the day Jesus washes the disciples' feet before the Last Supper.

On Good Friday, remove the items. Take a crown of thorns and change to black cloth.

Easter morning, add lilies or other flowers and butterflies.

Other symbols for personal home altar are dice, rooster, crown of thorns and a sponge.

All of these are hopefully just a jumping off point. There are so many ways to grow closer during this time of Lent at home. Sharing in these new and different ways and thinking creatively to grow together as a family, I hope you share them with us. Send us a photo of your creations please either on Facebook or to me through email.
