SMALL GROUPS & ACTIVITIES TO RESUME

Effective June 1, all Bible studies, small groups and other programs and ministries can resume in person gatherings on campus as each group desires, but we ask that everyone still follow safety protocols regarding face masks. Please contact your group leader for specifics and check the calendar.

SUMMER WORSHIP SCHEDULE

Because of multiple factors, at this point, our plan is to continue with only one worship service at 9am through the summer. We plan on resuming two worship services in the fall.

WORSHIP

Our return to worshipping inside has been a learning experience, but it has still been wonderful. We continue our attempts to make decisions for the health of ourselves and our neighbors, but it is a very complex situation dealing with many different factors (of which we try to consider as many as possible). As you can see from the "Choosing Safer Activities" chart on page 10, many people can safely gather at a variety of functions, while it is less safe for others. These are some of the difficulties we face in coordinating these efforts. We continue to ask for your grace and understanding in regards to our gatherings.

Adjustments from what we've already learned:

We are no longer requiring the physical distancing for seating in the sanctuary or upon entry/exit.

We will begin printing bulletins again, even though we will continue to show liturgy on the screens.

We will also offer nursery care again during worship.

Seating - all barriers have been removed from the pews on the pulpit side and you may sit where you wish. For anyone who still prefers to have some space in front and back of them the pews on the organ/piano side will still have the barriers on every other pew, but you can sit in any unbarricaded pew.

Continuing measures:

We are still asking for everyone to wear masks while in the building and to use the reservation system to attend worship. But we continue to re-evaluate this process frequently. While this may feel off-putting, it is a safeguard in our contact tracing efforts, should they become necessary.

We will also continue the use of the disposable communion kits, which can be picked up in the lobby when entering.

Additionally, we are still not singing during the music times (again we continue to re-evaluate this policy).

Ushers will continue to dismiss from the back of the sanctuary AFTER the sending song.

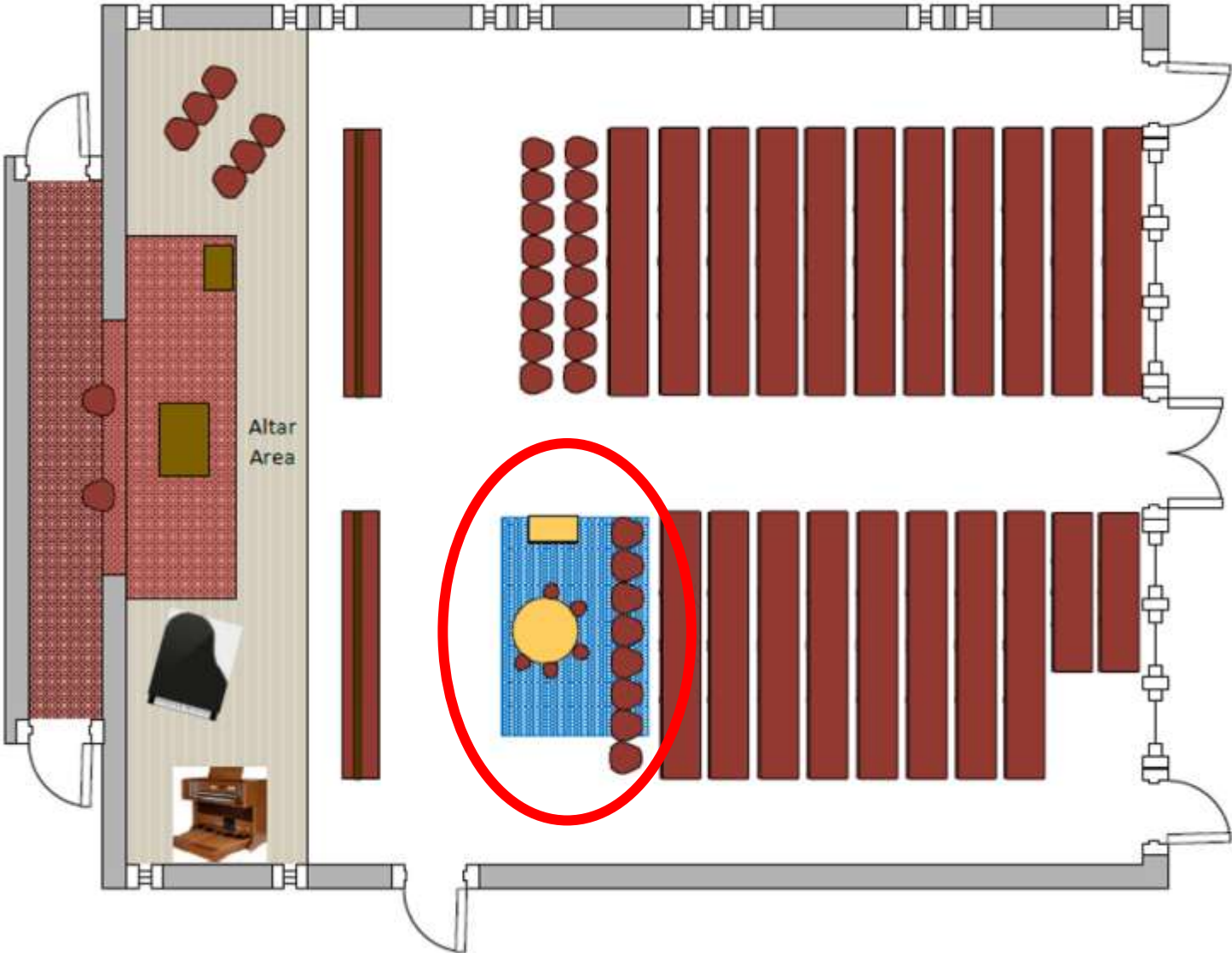
CTK PRAY-GROUND IS HERE AND MORE IS COMING!!!!

“Jesus said, ‘Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of heaven belongs.’” Matthew 19:14

Over the past few months, actions have been completed to enable our youngest members and their families to have a more engaging worship experience. In the front of our nave, you will see chairs and a small table on the organ/piano side and we will be adding more items in the future. This area is there both for our young ones to experience worship in a comfortable setting for them and for ease of their family to ‘gather around’ them as they do so. This area is called a pray-ground and we introduced the idea back in the March newsletter.

As a reminder, a pray-ground is an inviting space that's especially designed for children and their families to experience worship through age-appropriate worship materials and to help keep them engaged in worship. According to the “brain development of a young child, they need opportunities to be part of something, so they see it as an important part of who they are.” By providing this space (in addition to our other ministries), our hope is to help some of our younger members see worship as an important part of who they are.

This has also allowed us to have more flexible seating in other areas for wheelchairs and walkers.

You may have seen this quote by Sonya Renee Taylor in the past since the pandemic began. There is so much truth in it, as well as heartache (on a number of levels). We know that, as humans, we are broken people - prone to any number of shortcomings, which inevitably cause harm and hurt to others. But, ONE of the beauties of our faith is the status we hold as forgiven and beloved children of God and siblings with one another. And because of this, we always have the opportunity to get better.

In a monthly email, the Rev. Dr. Robin Steinke, President of Luther Seminary, addressed our (human) situation so perfectly that I will share her thoughts instead of trying to re-create something else. “Will things go back to the way they were before? I don’t think that’s even remotely possible. The world has fundamentally changed. We have fundamentally changed. Yet I have no doubt that whatever new ways of living, working, and being community together emerge post-pandemic, they will soon feel as natural as life felt before.

This is the way of things. Just as winter gives way to spring, what was once considered radical becomes the status quo—until something happens to disrupt our patterns, and the cycle repeats again. It can be exhausting and exhilarating and a little bit frightening. Yet in the midst of constant change, we can hold tight to the promises of God, who has told us not to fear.

“Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you. When you walk through the fire, you will not be burned; the flames will not set you ablaze. For I am the LORD, your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior” Is 43:1-2.”

This promise, like so many others throughout the Bible, offers us words of hope, comfort, and encouragement. We can trust that no matter what this post-pandemic “new normal” brings, God will be walking with us through it all. PLUS ..., we have each other. ❤️

Stewardship Message, June, 2021

The Man in the Mirror

Me—To myself--Uh Oh!. I can see where this guy is going. He wants to see how I am doing in my spiritual growth, i.e. my "**Stewardship of Self**".

Me—I told him I especially like to sing.

Mirror—That's great, So, what are some of your favorite hymns?

Me—I especially like:

Stand Up, Stand Up for Jesus, and
I Love to Tell the Story

Mirror—I assume you know that singing is like talking, meaning that it is assumed that you believe what you sing, just like you believe what you say. So, when is the last time you stood up for Jesus, or told His story? I mean to someone other than a fellow church member?.

Me—I said Uh-Oh, and started to squirm a little. At that point, I said, well, it's about time to leave for church. (at this point I was glad the clock was on my side because I could tell I was experiencing the beginning of a guilt trip). So I thanked the man in the mirror for sharing his thoughts and I left for church. As I was driving down Pat Booker Road, and thinking about my encounter with the man in the mirror, it became obvious that I have a lot of opportunity for improvement in my **Stewardship of Self**. Perhaps we should all have a look at the person in the mirror.
