## **ALL SAINTS' SUNDAY - NOVEMBER 7TH**

On November 7th, we will celebrate All Saints' Sunday with a display of candles in remembrance of those who have died in the last year. If you would like a candle added on the altar for someone who was NOT a member of Christ the King, but died in the past year, please call the church office before November 5th. We will also have votive candles available during the service for everyone to light remembering anyone who died before November 2020.



**DAYLIGHT SAVINGS TIME** ends on Sunday, November 7th. So, remember to set your clocks back on Saturday night before you go to bed.

## **MILITARY RECOGNITION SUNDAY - NOVEMBER 14TH, 9:00AM**

On Sunday, November 14th, we will honor all military personnel, veterans and their families at worship. This is a synod-wide recognition to show gratitude and support for the service our military members have provided. Breakfast for veterans and members immediately after worship in the Fellowship Hall.



## **WORSHIP CHANGES**

Beginning on Reformation Sunday (Oct 31), we resumed congregational singing of all the songs during worship. Because of this, we will still be requiring facemasks to help ensure a safe environment.

**Beginning November 28th (1st Sunday of Advent),** we will return to **TWO WORSHIP TIMES**; one at 8am and the second at 10:30am. This is an exciting step, but will also necessitate other changes. Therefore, please realize that both services may not be the same. For instance, we do not currently have enough people helping Altar Guild. Therefore, we will have communion **EVERY Sunday, but NOT at both services**. We will celebrate communion on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month at the 8am worship service and on the 2nd and 4th Sundays at the 10:30am worship service. (5th Sundays will have communion at both).

Volunteers are essential to helping worship to happen and we give sincere thanks to everyone who has helped out. Because we will need more volunteers (for two services), please check out the new board in the narthex / lobby which will share the helpers we need for THAT day/service (or with specific tasks that still need to be done). Please step up and help out if you are able. Every small act is significant in growing the Kingdom of God.

Please continue to move to the center of the pews (as you are able) when you arrive for worship to allow others (arriving after you) easier access to seating.

Heaven and Nature Sing includes daily devotions based on year C scripture readings (in the Revised Common Lectionary) for Sundays and festival days between the first Sunday of Advent (November 28, 2021) through Epiphany (January 6, 2022).

*Evangelism Is  
Alive in Malawi*

“In spite of COVID-19, ministry continues. Those are words from Evance Mphalasa, a pastor and acting general secretary of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Malawi (ELCM), words that have energized him and a team of evangelists as they spread the gospel despite the setbacks of the pandemic.

Strict government measures issued in early 2020 closed some of the churches in Malawi and restricted gatherings to 100 people, said Feston Phiri, pastor, ELCM director for training and secretary for mission and evangelism. Churches that remained open had to provide congregants with masks, sanitizer and water buckets - unbudgeted expenses that proved financially devastating. Additionally, the printing of Sunday school and evangelism materials — particularly those in the Tumbuka language — stopped completely because most offices were closed, Phiri said. Malawian evangelists were not deterred.

2020 was ‘a very hard time indeed in regard with evangelism in Malawi, but I think the whole world [was challenged],’ he said. ‘Despite this COVID-19, as a problem, Malawi has not stopped evangelizing. [We simply used] a different approach.’ Pastors hosted two, three, even four services each Sunday to accommodate the small-gathering restrictions. To further share the gospel, Phiri said, evangelists organized a van equipped with loudspeakers so they could preach and sing to people in their homes. ‘We used this van and this singing group, which is a praise team, evangelizing, going around to different areas, reaching out to different people with this kind of way,’ he said. ‘This exercise was done during [the evenings] ... when people are in their houses, so it was very easy to reach them.’

Many first-world countries turned to social media to continue faith conversations and stay connected to parishioners, but Malawians lacked that luxury. ELCM Bishop Joseph Bvumbwe created a virtual forum for Malawi pastors, providing daily updates so the pastors could stay at the forefront of helping their parishes. ‘Bishop never slept; he was always helping to get us the latest information about COVID-19, always sending messages through the forums for pastors,’ said Mphalasa. ‘Then, the pastors disseminated the information.’

This outreach — part of which was funded through ELCA Mission Support — has encouraged and increased the growth of the church, even during the COVID-19 pandemic. ‘Without your help, we wouldn’t be talking about expanding the church,’ Phiri said. “The church is growing so fast and so rapidly. This is very important.”<sup>1</sup>

This is one of many stories telling how your donations are making a difference in the world.

Every funeral includes praising God in Christ who is our hope and our salvation, even as we remember the deceased and give thanks to God for the time shared with that person.

Christians view death as another step in our life as children of God. Yet, Christians also experience death as a time of loss when sorrow, grief, and bereavement are both natural and appropriate. In the first days following a loved one's death, the family makes an average of 200 decisions. During such an emotional, stressful and demanding time, plans that have been made earlier lighten the load after death. If you've not made advance plans, talk with Pastor Mike.

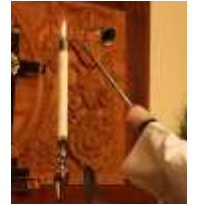
