WORSHIP TIMES & COMMUNION

We have resumed holding two worship service times (8am & 10:30am) and will continue to offer Drive-In radio transmissions as well as a live-stream (and later posting of the recorded service). For the time being, communion will be offered EVERY Sunday, but NOT at both services. On the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month, we will celebrate communion at 8am. While offering it at 10:30 on the 2nd and 4th Sundays.

A WORD FROM THE PASTOR ...

In preparing for Advent, I ran across an article from Dr. Kelly Flanagan that said, "In the last month, I've heard countless people say they decorated early for Christmas this year because they needed a little more joy. Many of us, it seems, were deeply craving a season of lights. And, of course, we were"¹. This makes sense given all the world is going through over the last year (and more). The joy of this time of year is wonderful. It can help lighten our moods. It's almost magical.

BUT, the thing is this article was from 2016!!! As we know, this was not the first difficult year in the history of humanity (and it wasn't even the first pandemic in history). I'm not trying to downplay the difficulties we have experienced through the pandemic. But I am lifting up that we have faced many difficult situations and times in the past. And we have gotten through them. Leona Hietala shared an interesting quote in Bible study that speaks to this. "Today is the tomorrow I worried about yesterday and all is well." We often worry about things in the future or the unknown things or the things out of our control. And yet, as the quote reminds us, we have gotten through them; not only gotten through them, but life is well.

We don't know what tomorrow will bring and yet we still have hope. We trust in God and also in our relationships with one another. Advent may not seem like a necessity right now or even something we want to observe. We don't need four weeks of gloom and doom, because in some ways, it feels like our lives have been nothing but desolation and shadows for twenty-one months.

Dr. Flanagan also said, "this year, it feels like we need more than twelve days of Christmas. We need twelve months. We need the coming year to shine as if Christmas forgot to end. Yet, no one can make a whole year shine. ...All you can do is let your own light shine. All you can do is drop a quarter in that red tin bucket when you hear the bells ringing. All you can do is pay for the people behind you in the drive-thru. All you can do is look every solemn stranger in the eye and smile into their misery. ...All you can do is choose vulnerability over fear, belonging over division, and love over everything else. Above all love!! All you can do is believe the words of that little Baby who grew up to tell us all, 'You are the light of the world ... let your light shine.'"¹

In this time of unknowns (which in reality EVERY time is a time of unknowns), let YOUR light shine. Help others overcome their sadness, struggles and problems and in so doing, you may just overcome your own (if you have any). Be who you were created by God to be and share the gifts God gave you. And THANKS! Thanks for all the ways you share God's love with others around you!

Stewardship Message

“The world asks, ‘What does a man own?’ Christ asks, ‘How does he use it?’”

You will recall that we previously informed the congregation that for the nine months ended September 30, our expenses exceeded our income by \$26,000. At that time, it seemed that it would be extremely difficult to reverse this trend by year end.

Our congregation has always risen to the challenge, and we were confident that, just as we have done in the past, we would overcome. On October 21, we sent a letter to our members asking that they prayerfully consider increasing their giving as they were able. We asked that our focus not be on what we can't do, but rather focus on what we can.

Now, let us fast forward to today, and look what you have done! During the month of October, our income exceeded our expense by \$16,962. This means that the previous deficit has now been reduced to \$9,600. This is a significant turn-around and sets the stage for even greater possibilities by year end.

Where do we go from here? We now have the momentum, and like a freight train, once it gets moving, it will be hard to stop. As mentioned above, let us not focus on what we do not think we can do, but rather focus on what we have done and can do.

We have enormous possibilities, and are convinced that by working together we will continue to be successful in reducing the deficit we now face. And by so doing, we will continue “growing disciples for Christ”.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

We realize this has been a financially difficult year for many and like you, we have limited our expenses. Even so, we're facing a fairly significant deficit for the budget this year and we need to increase our income. At the end of October, our total income (for the year) was \$268,644.51 and our total expenses were \$278,220.90. Therefore, income minus expenses totaled -\$9,479.42 (a deficit). The church council is asking you to prayerfully consider increasing your giving, as you are able. Every little bit helps as we continue to make a difference in our community, "serving neighbors near and far".

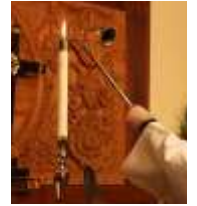

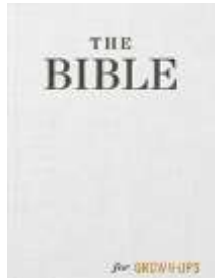
