Stewardship Message January, 2022

You will recall that we previously informed the congregation that for the nine months ended September 30, our expenses exceeded our income by \$26,500. At that time, it seemed that it would be extremely difficult to reverse this trend by year end.

However, we are pleased to report that as of November 30, the deficit has been reduced from \$26,500 to \$7,090. This is a significant turn around, and we thank the congregation for their positive response.

We encourage the congregation to contribute as they are able so that by year end, we will have received sufficient income to pay for all 2021 expenses.

This goal is within reach because our congregation has always demonstrated a strong commitment to support our mission at home, and ministry beyond the parking lot.

We have enormous possibilities, and are convinced that by working together we will continue to be successful in "growing disciples for Christ".

Via De Cristo Reunion Group

Via De Cristo, a Spanish phrase meaning "Way of Christ," is a cursillo - or short course of study. It is a spiritual renewal weekend designed for people who wish to further their Christian journey in life. This structured three-day weekend is designed to strengthen and renew the faith of Christian people, bringing them to a new, profound awareness of living in God's grace. Participants are encouraged to proclaim the good news of grace given by Jesus and extend that grace not only to His church, but to the environment in which the church exists. It is a lay-led, intensely joyful and uplifting weekend based completely on grace and love... an excellent way to develop lay leadership in your home congregation!

Via De Cristo weekends are scheduled regionally. Our church is part of the Texas Lutheran Via de Cristo group. Normally two weekends are scheduled each year. The next scheduled weekend is Weekend #100 and has tentatively been scheduled for February 17-20, 2022 at Camp Sionito in Bandera, TX.

Once you have completed your Via De Cristo weekend, you are encouraged to join a group for perseverance. Reunion Groups are small groups that meet regularly to study, pray, share and help one another in their quest for spiritual development. This weekly group may include individuals from other congregations who have completed Via De Cristo, Walk to Emmaus (Methodist) or ACTS (Catholic).

PERIODIC CHANGES IN WORSHIP PRACTICES

Father Richard Rohr, Franciscan priest and author, shared this meditation recently.

"Many are convinced that rituals and "practices" like a contemplative Eucharist, the rosary, processions and pilgrimages, repetitive chants, genuflections and prostrations, physically blessing oneself (as with the sign of the cross), singing, and silence have operated as a kind of *body-based rewiring*. Such practices allow us to know Reality mystically and contemplatively from a unitive consciousness. But, over time, as these practices turned into repetitive obligations, they degenerated; and most people came to understand them magically as divinely required transactions. Instead of inviting people into new consciousness, these practices often froze people in their first infantile understanding of those rituals, and *transactions ended up substituting for transformations*.

Mindless repetition of any practice, with no clear goal or purification of intention, can in fact keep us quite unconscious—unless the practices keep breaking us into new insight, desire, compassion, and an ever-larger notion of God and ourselves. Catatonic repetition of anything is a recipe for unconsciousness, the opposite of any real consciousness, intentionality, or spiritual maturity. If spirituality does not support very real growth in both inner and outer freedom, it is not authentic spirituality. It is such basic unfreedom that makes so many people dislike and mistrust religious people."

Rituals and traditions play a HUGE role in our faith lives and in our worship practices. Even so, as Fr. Rohr states, it is important to remember WHY we do and say the different things that we do. This is one reason why we periodically change some of the components in worship. Many years ago, you may recall we learned the Lord's Prayer in American Sign Language. We have used the Masai Creed and other variations instead of the Apostles or Nicene Creed. We recently used the contemporary version of the Lord's Prayer. All of these efforts are opportunities for new insights into our faith and into the mystery of God. We realize they can be off-putting and even annoying. For that, we apologize, but please realize these efforts are meant with the best intentions and in order to help you GROW in your faith instead of complacency.


