Rachel's Day 2022



Rachel's Day is a memorial that was originally designed to shed light on the devastating effect of gun violence against children. Designated on the first Sunday in May each year, this day is based on Jeremiah 31:15–17 wherein Rachel grieved for her children, to mourn the loss of our children and to renounce the forces of evil and fear that plague our nation." ***Rachel's Day has come to include advocating against all forms of violence against children and teens.***

According to TexProtects (<https://www.texprotects.org/>), more than **4** children die from abuse or neglect on average every week, **184** children are confirmed victims daily, and more than **7** children are maltreated every hour in Texas. There are four basic types of child abuse. These are neglect, physical abuse, emotional abuse, and sexual abuse. Children being abused are likely to experience more than just one type of abuse.

How can you help? Know the signs of abuse, including changes in eating, sleeping, behaviors, lower performance or attendance at school, lack of personal care or hygiene, inappropriate sexual or risk-taking behaviors, and fear of certain places or people.

In Texas, we are required by law to report suspected child abuse: if you suspect a child is in immediate danger, call 911. For all other cases in Texas, call the abuse & neglect hotline at: (800) 252-5400.

“Energy for Life and Death” -by Peggy Hahn, Executive Director of LEAD, April 21, 2022

Energy for Life and Death: The Difference is Staggering

I have had the extreme privilege of accompanying my Daddy on his journey to be with Jesus this week. My heart is so heavy I can hardly breathe while writing this today. The choice to share this publicly is motivated by the shocking differences between life and death. To those that know me, it will be no surprise that the parallels between this journey for a person we love and for the church we love are screaming in my head. Confusion around life and death is everywhere in congregational life, so I pray offering this reflection on energy is helpful.

Use of energy preparing for DEATH

The journey to be with Jesus in death is filled with desperation. Reactivity around symptoms, endless time with specialists who offer cures that may feel worse than the sickness, and then finally the slowing down of pace. Then more slowing of pace to barely moving, until it reaches no movement at all, except for the jarring alerts of beeps and buzzes of hospital care.

Next is the almost-final move to palliative care, where the energy shifts to grief as loved ones begin to mourn more at each visit. We moved to my parents' home, in our case, but this takes many forms as an even slower pace is experienced while living out the last days. Slow for everyone except the caregivers who are ramping up with new work, managing meds and equipment. The days and nights are basically the same pace as energy expands to include caring for the most vulnerable family members.

The holy transition of a person from this world to the next leaves me without words. The last few shallow breaths felt peaceful as we sat watching. This will never leave my memory added to a lifetime of joy, laughter, and love. So much love.

Then it feels too abrupt. Too fast. Too many decisions to make too quickly when all I wanted to do was sit there feeling my Daddy's spirit in the room. So, we chose not to rush; we choose not to rush.

Dying church, do you see yourself? Reactivity around symptoms, like worship style and programs that begin to feel like chemo treatments with some working and some just making the church sicker. Palliative care with the shift to focusing on those grieving the loudest. The holy transition of decisions made to manage resources and property given for new life. The old ways end, feeling like it all went too fast as people grieve and have a good laugh.

Use of energy preparing for LIFE

The journey to bring a new life into this world is an act of passion. Hopefully healthy passion, but either way, life begins. Months of anticipation – even if not enough time for preemies. Rethinking space to make room for a baby and for baby stuff opens up new imagination for daily life. Trips to the doctor for reassurance or in some cases worrisome news that sparks prayers of hope as parents are formed, thinking about the life growing in them more than themselves.

The screams of pain in childbirth, followed mostly by screams of breath in the child, launching a whole new human being into the universe with promise and sweetness. Medical professionals surrounding the baby with exactly what is needed and advising parents on next steps.

Then the naming, claiming in the sacrament of baptism, family practices, exhausted new parents, proud grandparents biting their tongue to stop unwanted advice, and so much love unfolding. Irresistible love. Possibilities, hope, imagination, and wonder unfolding.

Living church, do you see yourself? Passionate for life, anticipating the future, rethinking space to maximize resources, sparking new imagination for daily life? People thinking more about new life growing than themselves? The struggles to kick off a whole new way of being church. Energy from Death for Life

Energy spent loving people who are dying and people who are birthed is about as close as we get to God in this world. Both are sacred journeys in which the Holy Spirit is moving. As humans, we are not given the power to manage these parts of life.

One is energy decreasing; the other is energy increasing. The energy is not reckless but thoughtfully designed by God, by professionals, by each of us. We are, with the help of God, called to join in this energy. Energy for death if the liturgical church season is nearing completion, so that the resources can become seeds for new life. Or possibly energy for life if the community cares more about Jesus and others than themselves.

This Easter season, please, make a decision for life. (The best advice my Daddy ever gave me, but that’s a story for a different day.) Happy Easter!

On behalf of the Board of Directors and volunteers at RACAP, thank you for your continued support of the food pantry. January 2022 through March 2022, Christ the King donated \$2,299.00 to RACAP. During the month of March, the pantry saw 78 families, total number of 191 people, 61 pantry visits, and a total of 154 people fed. Estimated cost of food was \$7,641.92.
