### ADVENT – FROM GENERATION TO GENERATION

Our theme for Advent is based on Luke 1:48b-50 where Mary says, "Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed; for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name. His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation.

Despite the challenges and vulnerability she faced, Mary could glimpse the scale and scope of the good news she was part of bringing forth. This good news transcends time and space—it was and is bigger than just her. Christ is coming for collective liberation: God's redemption is at work for years to come. Therefore, the promise is meant to be lived out and passed on from generation to generation.



We are invited to look at the characters in our scriptures and wonder: What did each character pass on or contribute? How did each character participate in God's liberation and love? Which characters try to thwart God's justice and what can we learn from them? What is our role now? What is our generation's task? What will we carry forth, and what should we leave behind?

The root word of "generation" is "gen" meaning "origin" or "birth." Our theme is also a call to action: what are we being called to generate or bring forth? What have your ancestors and those who have come before you passed on for you to continue? Who are the spiritual elders in your community who planted the seeds for the things that are now blooming? What seeds are you planting for the future?

"From Generation to Generation" reminds us of the ways our lives, histories, actions, and stories are interconnected and woven together. In the midst of narratives, policies, and rhetoric designed to divide us, what does it look like to practice belonging to one another? The work of God is always unfolding— in and through us. This Advent season, how will we carry it forth?



Back when we were celebrating the Season of Creation, one resource I ran across included this poem. It spoke to me and I thought I might use it in a sermon some time in the future, but I have come to realize that I'd prefer it to be included here in the newsletter; so that y'all can see it in print and re-read whenever you like.

### **WALK DON'T RUN** By Rob Bell

Walk, don't run.  
That's it. Walk, don't run.  
Slow down, breathe deeply,  
and open your eyes because there's a whole world right here within this one.  
The bush doesn't suddenly catch on fire,  
it's been burning the whole time.  
Moses is simply moving slowly enough to see it.  
And when he does, he takes off his sandals.  
Not because the ground has suddenly become holy,  
but because he's just now becoming aware that the ground has been holy the whole time.  
Efficiency is not God's highest goal for your life,  
neither is busyness,  
or how many things you can get done in one day,  
or speed, or even success.  
But walking, which leads to seeing,  
now that's something.  
That's the invitation for every one of us today,  
and every day, in every conversation, interaction, event,  
and moment: to walk, not run.  
And in doing so,  
to see a whole world right here within this one.

As we head into the holiday season and the busyness which it brings, this poem is a nice reminder that we are invited to spend time with God (especially when things seem most chaotic) in order that we may see some of the blessings that abundantly fill our lives. So I invite you to walk, don't run today, in this season of giving thanks, and always.

## **ANNOUNCEMENT**

The nominating committee is looking for individuals to fill **three** vacancies on the 2023 church council – Education (Learning Ministries), Fellowship, and Shepherding Ministry.



**Education (Learning Ministries)**, vacated by Sheri Boos, provides, and promotes a wide range of Christian education opportunities for the church through the Sunday

School (SS) program that includes determining the SS curriculum; operates and administers the SS program; may organize VBS and any children’s programs other than SS; and develops the annual budget.

**Fellowship**, vacated by Susan Abbey, plans social events throughout the year to enhance interaction among members and friends of CTK and develops the respective budget. Such events may include the annual church gathering, the pancake supper prior to Lent, selected “Sundays” and monthly gatherings to name a few. Oversees other fellowship groups, e.g., Men’s Group, dominoes, etc.

The **Shepherding Ministry**, vacated by Leona Hietala and Cindy Nutt, has two sub-elements to develop intentional relationships in our community and within our congregation.

**Outreach:** Connects with those outside our worshipping community e.g., working with schools, other churches, city organizations; hosting or co-hosting community events such as night out, truck or treat, etc.; and contacting visitors who live in the local area.

**Care:** Connects with those within our worshipping community especially when they are dealing with illness, surgery, or any life crisis; been absent for an extended period; or to acknowledge them as faithful members.

All position chairs attend the monthly council meetings and submit an annual report for the annual congregational meeting.
