A WORD FROM PASTOR MIKE

I ran across an interesting article online and wanted to share it here (since it is highly unlikely to make it into a sermon, but is still worthy of sharing with y'all). Aish.com posted this.

"Did you know there's no Hebrew word for 'sin'? Three words are usually translated as sin, but none of them actually mean that. When you thumb through a Jewish prayer book, you see the word 'sin' all the time. That is because whoever translated the prayer book was trying to sound religious. 'Sin' may feel right in context, but it's not a good translation.



Chet (non) is usually translated as sin, but it doesn't mean that. It means 'to miss the mark', or 'to be off' (as in an archer missing the bullseye/target). In other words, 'a mistake'. Mistakes are manageable. You learn from mistakes. You don't learn from sin.

Avaira (עברה) is also usually translated as sin, but it doesn't mean that either. It means 'to transgress', or 'to cross a line'. Crossing a line is another type of mistake. You got carried away. You went too far. But again, with reflection and introspection, there's potential for growth.



Avon (עיין) is often translated as 'iniquity', but let's be real, no one knows what that is. The best way to understand it is as some kind of 'trouble'. It's more serious than a simply mistake, but still, it doesn't label you 'evil'. You're not a debased sinner condemned to the fiery pits of hell. You did something

wrong. Good, acknowledge that. Reflect, grow, make amends and move on."

As Christians (and especially as American Christians), we have an understanding of sin that is not accurate nor helpful to our understanding of faith and to our beliefs. We have used "sin" (both the word and the concept) as a tool to manipulate, coerce and control people. And yet, the way we have been using it is not at all what God intended.

As we know, God is a God of love and relationship. God wants us to better ourselves, serve others and share love. Let's reclaim these understandings and learn from the mistakes we make.

SYNOD ASSEMBLY OFFERING



Each year, Pastor Mike and a few representatives from Christ the King attend our Southwestern Texas Synod Assembly. The Assembly includes worship, business meetings), learning opportunities and fellowship time. Each year, we also take a congregational offering. The Synod Council usually designates the offering to be given to some specific ministry. This year, it will be given to Lutheran Disaster Response.

Lutheran Disaster Response (LDR) responds to global disasters (both natural and human caused) and because of their long standing history are often the first ones allowed into disaster sites. In the face of disaster, Lutheran Disaster Response shares relief today and builds resilience for tomorrow. From wildfires to hurricanes to refugee crises, LDR is present when disaster strikes, ready to accompany communities through relief and recovery. LDR is also in communities when there are no impending disasters, preparing people to mitigate the effects of a disaster and enabling them to bounce back more quickly.

The Church Council has set a goal for CTK to donate \$2,500. All of our midweek Lenten worship service offerings are going to this effort, but let's make sure to exceed our goal. Consider making a special donation. Please mark your envelope/online giving/check with "Synod offering".

UNDERSTANDING CHURCH OFFERINGS

Church offerings are more than just a part of worship services; they're a tangible expression of our faith and commitment to God's work. Through our offerings, we sustain the operational aspects of our church and contribute to the broader mission beyond our walls. But where exactly does your offering go when you designate these areas on your giving envelope or online giving?

The General Fund

The general fund is at the heart of our church's financial structure. This fund is essential for our day-to-day operations, supporting everything from salaries and building maintenance to utilities, administrative and program ministry costs. It ensures that our church remains a welcoming place of worship, education, and community

engagement. Offerings directed to the General Fund are crucial because they provide the flexibility to meet our congregation's most immediate and pressing needs. Undesignated offerings are automatically deposited in the General Fund.

Budgeted Accounts vs. Dedicated Accounts

Our church's finances are organized into two primary types of accounts: budgeted accounts and dedicated accounts. Budgeted accounts are those that the church council has identified as necessary for the fiscal year and included in the annual budget, which the congregation approves at our annual meeting. These include planned ministry expenditures, outreach, missions, and other operational costs. The General Fund primarily supports these budgeted accounts, aligning with our church's vision and mission. These funds do not carry over from year to year.

On the other hand, dedicated accounts are funds set aside for specific purposes and can only be used for those specific purposes and can be carried over from year to year. When you give to a dedicated account, your offering goes directly to that specified area of ministry or need, allowing you to support particular aspects of the church's work that you are passionate about. Some examples of dedicated accounts are RACAP, Lenten Offering, Lutheran World Relief, Building Fund (where you can direct your offerings to help with building renovations and upcoming improvements), Staff Gifts, Pastor's Discretion, WELCA, Women's Retreat, and many more. It's important to recognize that while giving to Dedicated Accounts is helpful for the specific areas you want to support, these contributions do not assist with the church's general operational costs or its bottom line. If you are unsure what to put on your offering to direct it to a specific purpose, please talk to the person in charge of that ministry or need.

Every offering, regardless of its size, makes a difference.

Our offerings reflect our gratitude to God and our commitment to God's work. By understanding how these funds are allocated, we hope to foster a spirit of transparency and stewardship within our congregation. Whether through supporting the day-to-day operations via the General Fund or contributing to dedicated accounts, your offerings play a vital role in our church's life and ministry. Let us continue giving generously and purposefully, trusting that God will use our offerings to accomplish great things in and through our church.

Remain alert at all times.

Remember you are on "duty" and the "front line."

Avoid extended conversations.

What are the responsibilities:

Every usher is given a copy of the "Usher Checklist". Additionally, the checklist is always available on the usher's table located in the narthex to the right of the double doors to the nave.
