SEPTEMBER STEWARDSHIP MESSAGE

A good steward is faithful.

In the Parable of the Talents (Matthew 25:14-30) Jesus tells the story of a master going on a long trip. He called together his servants and entrusted his silver to them while he was gone. He divided the silver in proportion to their abilities and left on his trip. The first two servants invested their silver and doubled the Master's money. The third servant buried his silver and did nothing with it. When the master returns, he rewards the first two servants. "Well done, good and faithful servant! You have been faithful with a few things; I will put you in charge of many things. Come and share your master's happiness!" (v.23)

When the Master finds the last servant did not use what he was given, there are consequences. "Then he ordered, "Take the money from this servant, and give it to the one with the ten bags of silver. To those who use well what they are given, even more will be given and they will have an abundance. But from those who do nothing, even what little they have will be taken away." (v.28-29)

The meaning of this parable extends beyond the use of money. God has given each one of us a variety of gifts. He expects us to use what He has given in the ways it is meant to be used. We are to use our gifts in service to him for his purpose and glory. Many ask why the master was so hard on this servant who had not increased his money. The third servant was not criticized because he fell short of doubling his investment. The Master was disappointed in him because he wasted an opportunity.

How often are we like the third servant? We worry that we cannot do something as well as someone else or that we will make an error and be criticized by others, so we do nothing with the talents He has given us. Like the master, God has given us many gifts to use for the benefit of his Kingdom. Do you want the Kingdom to grow? Do you trust God to govern fairly? Are you as concerned about the welfare of others as you are for your own? Are you willing to use faithfully what He has entrusted to you, faithful servant?

WHOLEHEARTED LIVING TOGETHER

“Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters.” Colossians 3:23

As Christians, we are called to be fully engaged in the ministry God has placed before us. This verse reminds us that our everyday actions – big or small – are opportunities to serve the Lord. Sometimes we think of serving God only in the grand moments: leading worship, teaching a class, or organizing a big event. But Paul reminds us that whatever we do can be an act of worship when done with the right heart. It’s not just about attending meetings or fulfilling obligations; it’s about bringing our whole heart into the work of the church. When we serve with passion, listen with intent, and lead with purpose, we reflect Christ’s love to those around us.

This requires more than just our presence – it calls for commitment, creativity, and a willingness to serve beyond our comfort zones. That includes how we engage with one another in our congregation. Greeting someone with a smile, sharing a meal, helping a child feel welcome, or offering encouragement to someone who is struggling – all of these are ways we “work for the Lord.” When our love and service are offered wholeheartedly, they become more than just good manners or helpful deeds. They become a reflection of Christ living in us.

True engagement also means staying connected to God and one another. When we lose sight of our spiritual foundation, our service can become routine rather than a joyful response to God’s call. We must intentionally seek God’s guidance, lean on each other for encouragement, and remain open to the Holy Spirit’s leading. True engagement is about pouring our hearts into community life because we see each other as beloved children of God. When we do this, our congregation becomes not just a group of people who gather on Sundays, but a family rooted in Christ’s love and purpose.

How might you engage with someone in our congregation this week in a way that reflects Christ’s love? Are you offering your time and service wholeheartedly, as unto the Lord?

Let us pray: Lord, thank You for the gift of this community. Help me to serve with all my heart—not out of duty, but out of love for You and for others. Teach me to see every interaction as a chance to reflect Your presence. May our congregation grow stronger as we work and love together, all for Your glory. Amen.

FOOD SECURITY



What is food security? According to the National Institute of Health, food security depends on the four **As**; the essential combination of **availability** (is there enough), **accessibility** (in the right place), **affordability** (for the whole population) and **adequacy** (for a nutritious, balanced diet). Accordingly, Texas and Bexar County are experiencing a food insecurity crisis.

People that struggle with food insecurity may experience a lack of food in the short term or for extended periods of time.

The food offered through the Kindness Cupboard is intended to be a temporary solution and does not address the root causes of food insecurity, like poverty, employment, and lack of access to resources. At times we may feel unrealistic guilt because we cannot offer more. However, boundaries are necessary to extend our resources to a larger community.

Whether it's our time, energy, or financial resources, it is important to help within our means. If assisting someone is exhausting any of these resources, it is time to stop. At times we may encounter individuals who prioritize their own needs and desires above others, lacking the capacity to understand or care about the impact of their actions on others. However, we continue to love and support them with respect and encouragement because in the long run we want what is best for them.

God wants us to be ready and willing to help whoever crosses our path, but He also expects us to be wise with our resources. The difference between helping and enabling them all comes down to having the strength to say no when we find ourselves doing things they should be doing for themselves. Therefore, we continue to strive to help others and not enable them in unhealthy ways.
