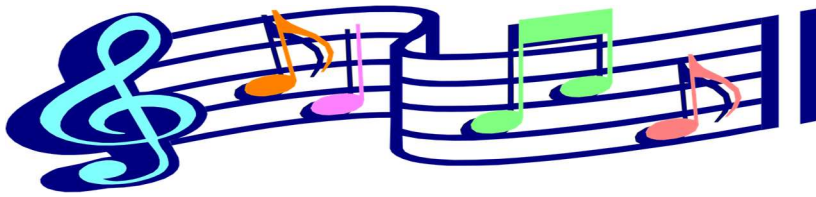
## OFFICE HOURS and PROTOCOLS

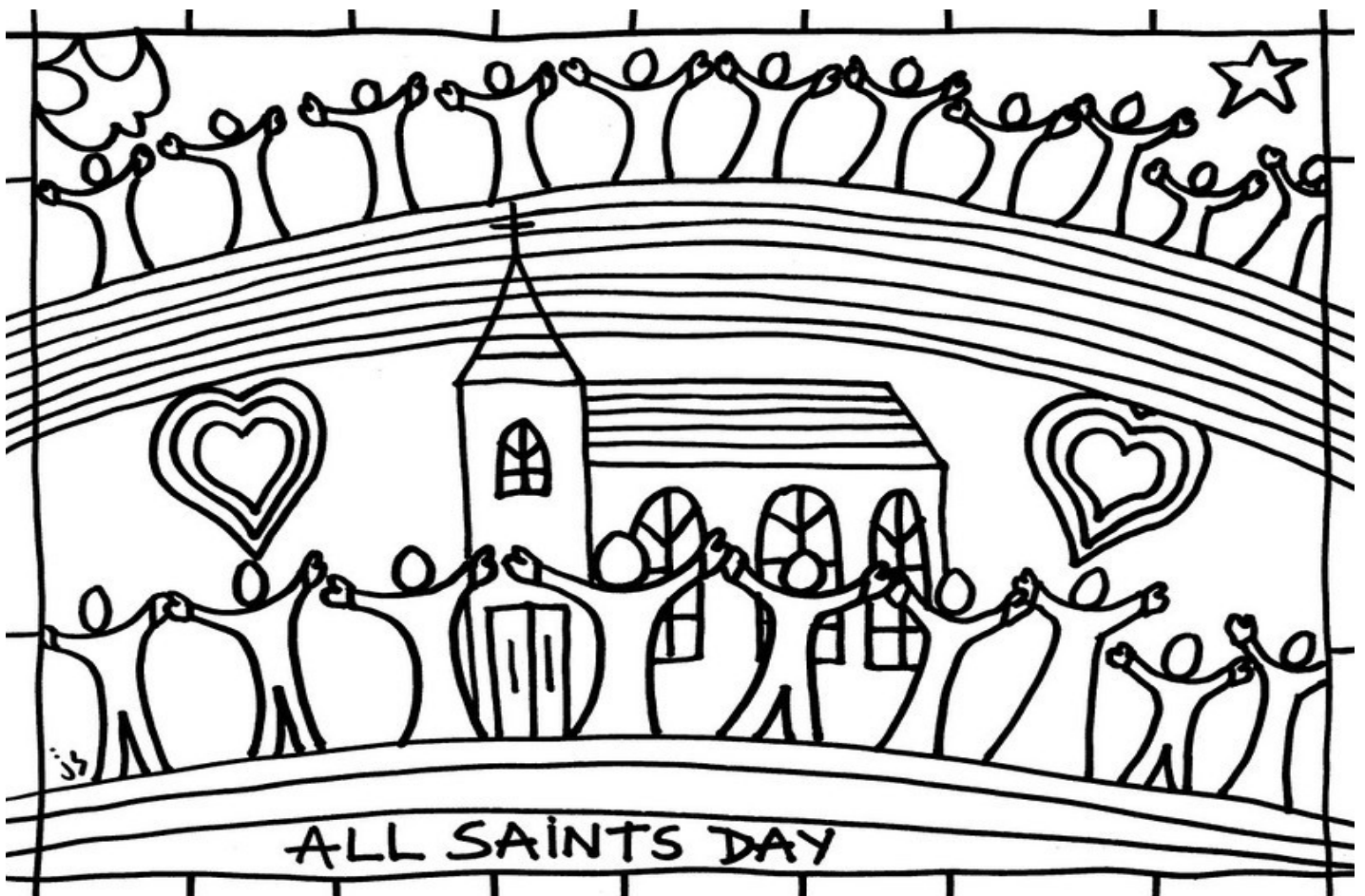
