## THE COUNCIL IS IN: *Shepherding News*

What is the shepherding ministry? Our official definition is: A well-connected community needs an avenue to develop intentional relationships that share life together, the Shepherding Ministry is that avenue. Outreach Ministry reaches out into the is the community and the Care Ministry provides individual care for members and friends of Christ the King. This vital team exemplifies love and faith through their tireless efforts to bring connection, encouragement, and spiritual care to others.

**Outreach** is simply that, using our resources to reach out and connect with the community at large outside of Christ the King Lutheran church. We do that in several different ways. In addition to providing donations of food and other needed items, CtK provides financial support to **RACAP** through monthly budgeted donations and dedicated donations from church members. Granted, we do not support all of RACAP's finances, but every little bit helps as they provide many services to the local community. **The Kindness Cupboard** began on April 11, 2023, as an idea to provide food through a cupboard placed along the street across from the Universal City Library. By grace and through generosity, the cupboard has sustained itself through today. Anyone can come and take food from the cupboard, no questions asked, no paperwork. Volumes of canned goods, bottles of water, packages of Pop-Tarts, oatmeal, snacks, and other essentials have passed through the cupboard. It is refilled daily through a rotation of volunteers, none of which would be possible if not for the food and financial support of CtK church family. **The Wilder Backpack** program provides for families of students at Wilder Intermediate School in the Schertz-Cibolo-Universal City Independent School District (SCUC ISD). These families apply through the school counselor who determines which families qualify for the program. This year we had 52 families assigned to CtK. The students bring an extra backpack to school that are picked up by our volunteers at CtK. The volunteers then provide vegetables, fruit, two meals and treats for each child, and if there is more than one child in the family, then for each of them as well. Meals are rotated so a variety is provided but depending on the size of the family, the backpack can get heavy. Once again, food donations and financial support from CtK family and friends have kept the program going strong.

**The Care Ministry** is rooted in compassion and dedicated to serving those who are no longer as mobile as they once were. This vital team exemplifies love and faith through their tireless efforts to bring connection, encouragement, and spiritual care to others. This dedicated team of volunteers send greeting cards, letters, and notes, e-mails, texts, and make calls to provide uplift and encouragement. They visit individuals who are homebound, ill, or in need of connection; serving communion to individuals, bringing spiritual nourishment to those unable to attend church. **Visitor Gift Bags** welcome new visitors to our church, as a simple act of giving and loving. This ministry, often overlooked, is a vital part of CtK. **The Warming and Cooling Centers** are a partnership with the Bexar County Office of Emergency Management to provide a center where individuals can get out of severe weather and have a safe place to stay during severe weather conditions. This center, when activated by Bexar County, also provides staff members, including reception staff from National Emergency Management and Response, law enforcement from the Bexar County Sheriff's Office, and EMTs from county or city fire departments. This partnership allows the Warming/Cooling Center to operate safely and consistently, 24 hours a day. Once again, the surrounding community responded with extraordinary generosity, providing food and much-needed supplies. At the close of the event, nothing was wasted. Kim Buck of Immaculate Hearts Food Ministry collected all remaining food that could not be used by our food security programs, along with soft goods not needed for future openings. Mayor Tom Maxwell and Universal City Police department provided support during the time it was open as well.

The Shepherding ministry is just an example of Ctk's mission statement of "serving God by loving others". It's so easy to say, well, someone will take care of it and leave it at that. We are the someone who does step up to do it, thanks to the many volunteers who serve the ministry, and the generosity of our donors.

## RACAP NEWS

### *(Randolph Area Christian Assistance Program)*

Following is the RACAP information showing the number of various individuals helped in April 2026: 66 Families (179 people) assisted; 57 Pantry Orders prepared – 150 people fed; Estimated value of food given: \$13,685.00. In addition to helping with food in April, RACAP also assisted 21 families with rental assistance and 21 families with assistance to pay their utilities.



If you or someone you know is in need, RACAP is open Monday-Friday, 1:00 pm until 3:00 pm. The RACAP food pantry is located at 307 Pfeil Street in Schertz.

RACAP will be collecting school supplies through July 14<sup>th</sup>. In addition to school supplies, they also include toothpaste and toothbrushes in the kits. School supplies needed for RACAP are: #2 pencils, Pens, Colored Pencils, Washable Markers, Rulers, Crayons, Scissors, Glue sticks, Wide rule spiral notebooks, Wide rule paper, Wide rule composition books, College rule paper, College rule spiral notebooks, and College rule composition books.

Current Needs at RACAP: Bars of Soap, Dish Soap, Laundry Soap, and Shampoo.

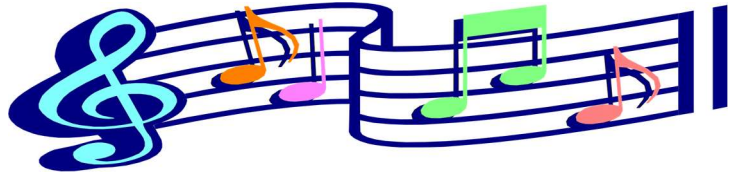
## KINDNESS CUPBOARD
